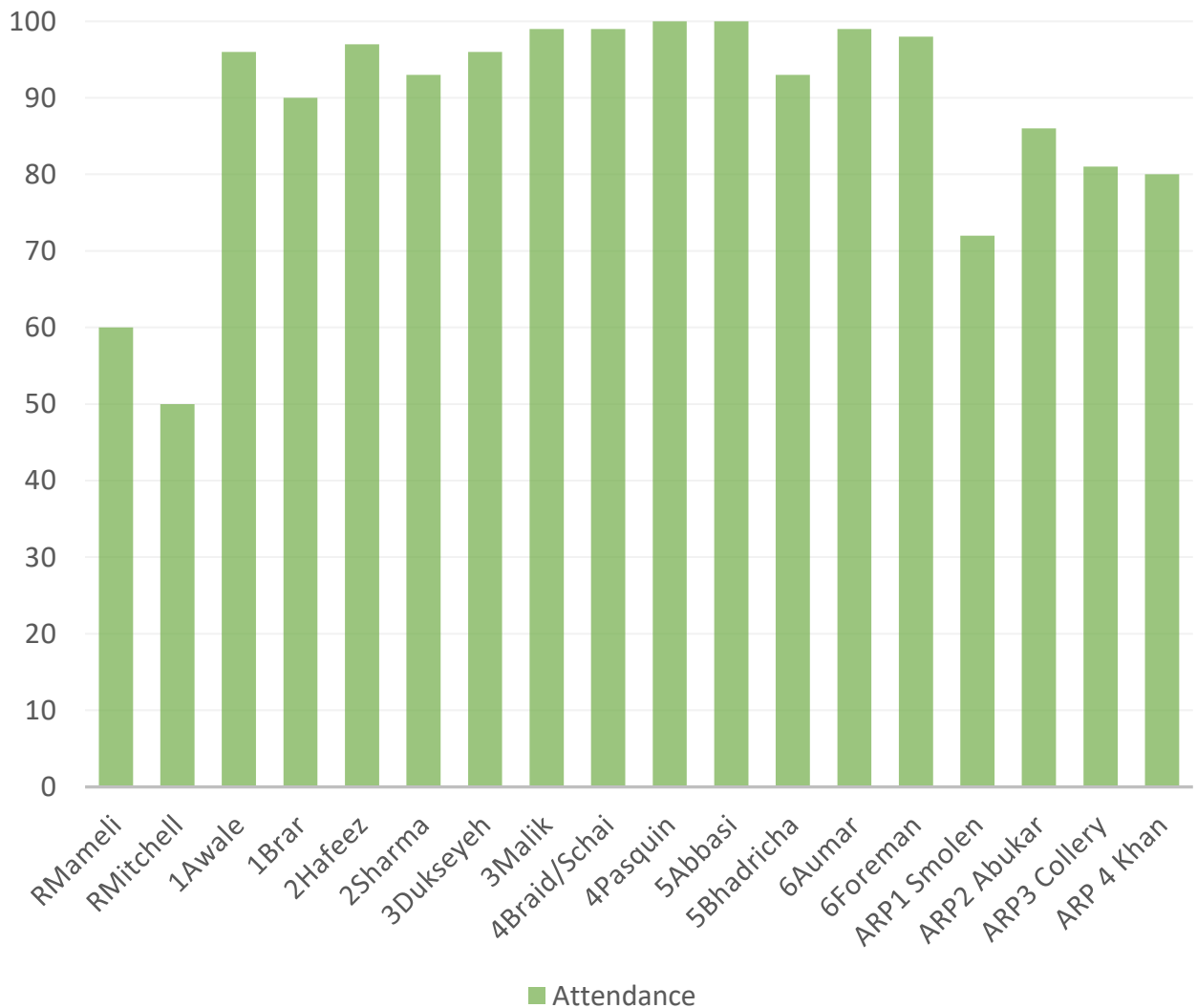
Attendance at Havelock

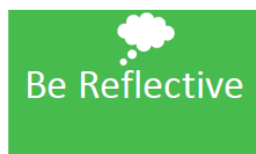
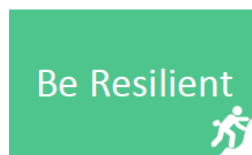
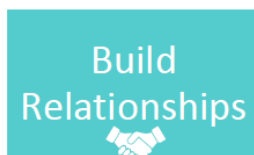
From climate change, education and mental health, to ending racism and discrimination, children and young people are raising their voices on the issues that matter to their generation and calling for adults to create a better future.

We are taking part in Readathon for the entire month of November. Children will be fundraising by reading as much as they can to raise money for sick children in hospital. To find out more information about

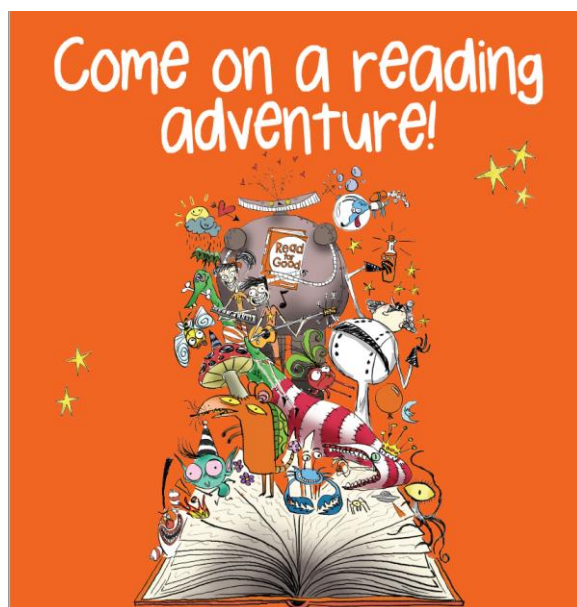

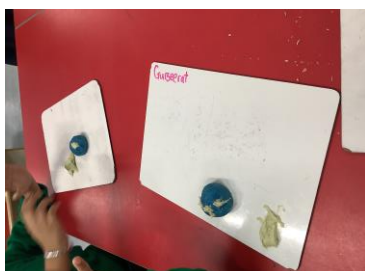
Reception celebrated 'World Children's day' (was on 20.11.23) to commemorate the 1989 adoption of the UN conventions on the rights of the children.



The children have been talking about the children's rights and how it impacts on their daily live.



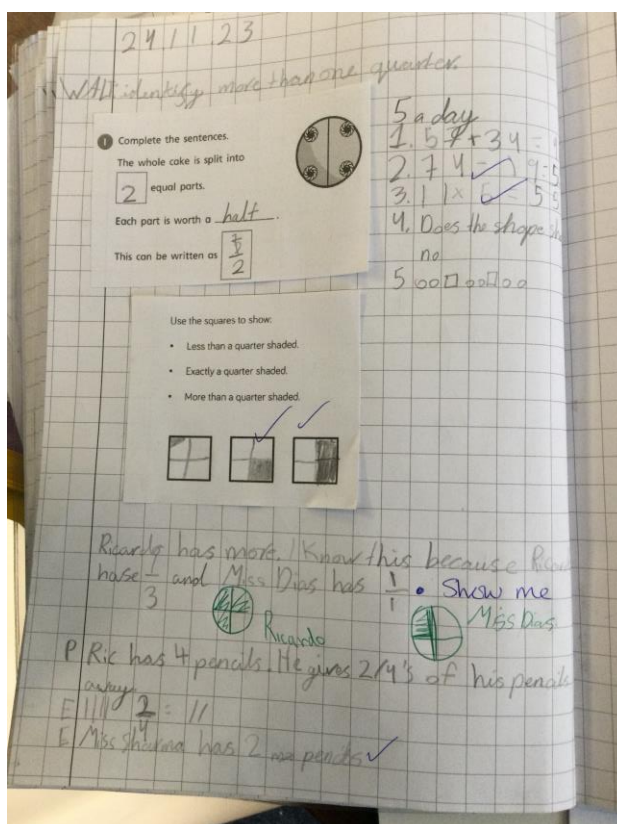
The children created mini planet earths and discussed how all children have the same right regardless of where they live.

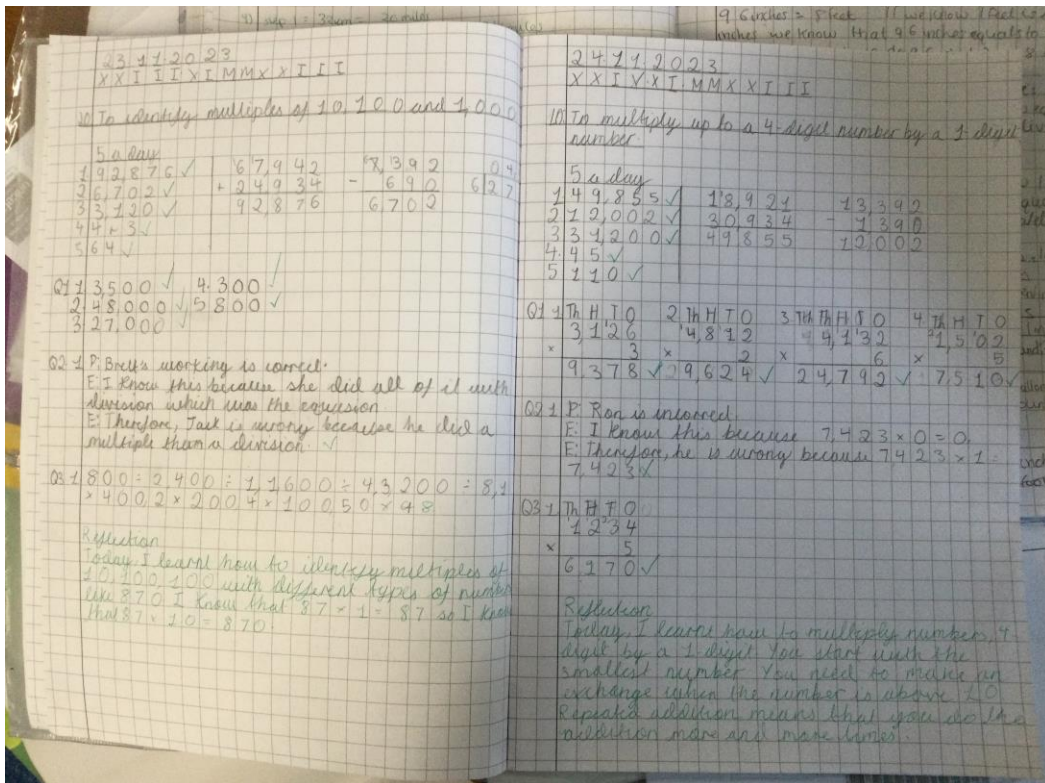

Maths at Havelock Year 5

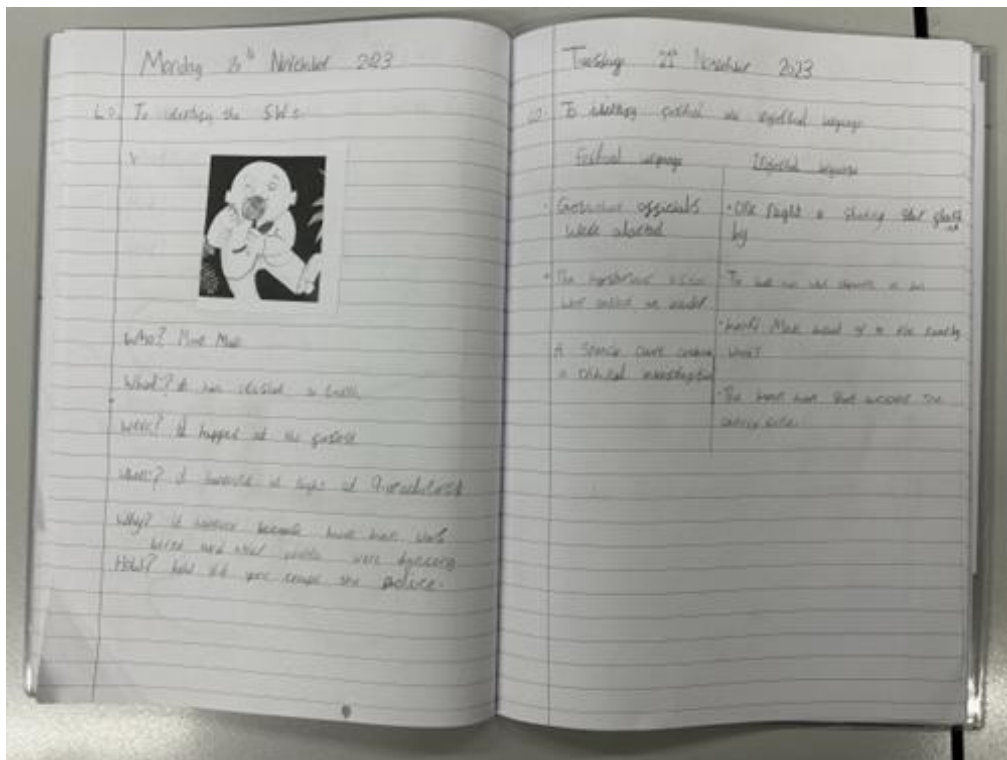

English at Havelock Year 3

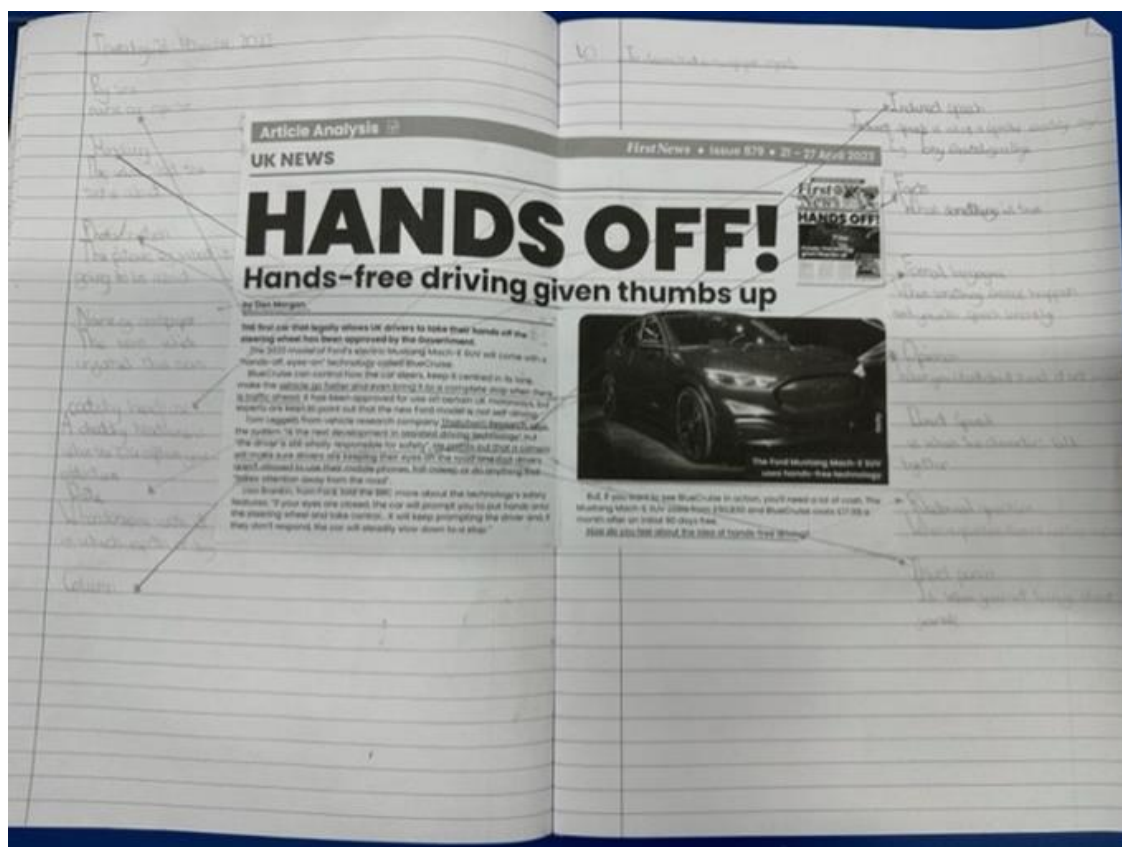

English at Havelock Year 4

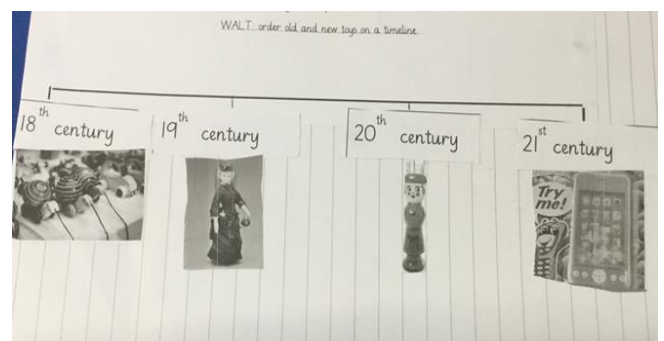
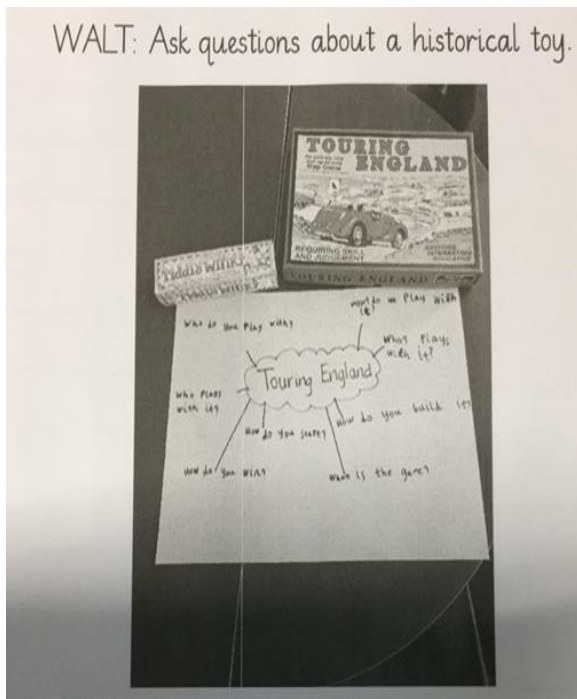

History at Havelock Year 1

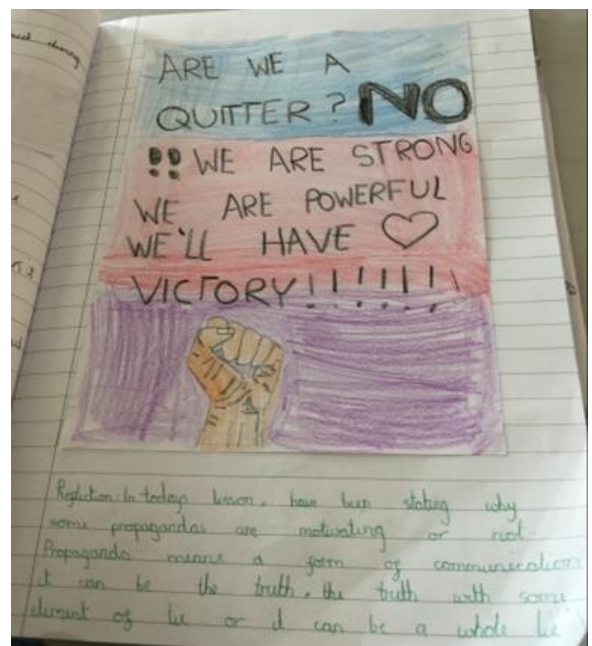
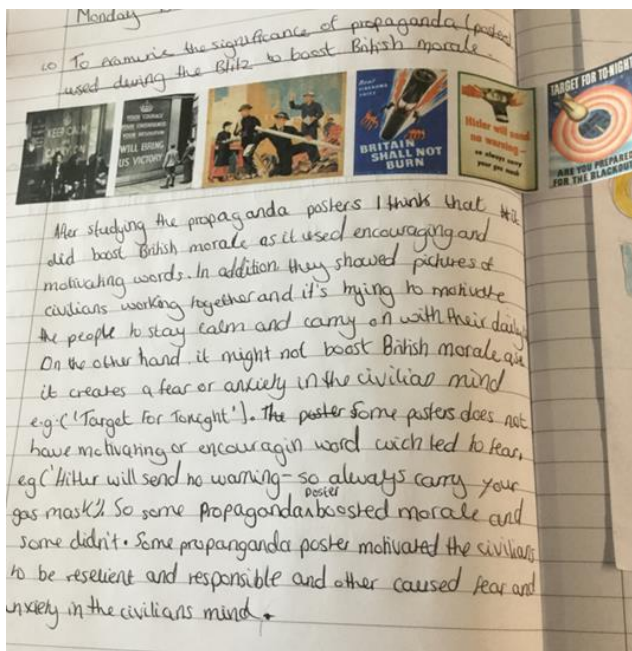

They have also developed their understanding of chronology by placing objects (toys) on a timeline and have independently asked questions about a selection of toys from the past.

History at Havelock Year 6

This term the children have been working extremely hard to answer our big question 'How significant was the Blitz is boosting British morale?' They have spent time using sources to communicate their ideas, construct and challenge the past. Additionally, they have interpreted the past by showing an awareness of the use of propaganda and how people in the past represent ideas in a way to persuade others prior to evaluating the usefulness of different sources.

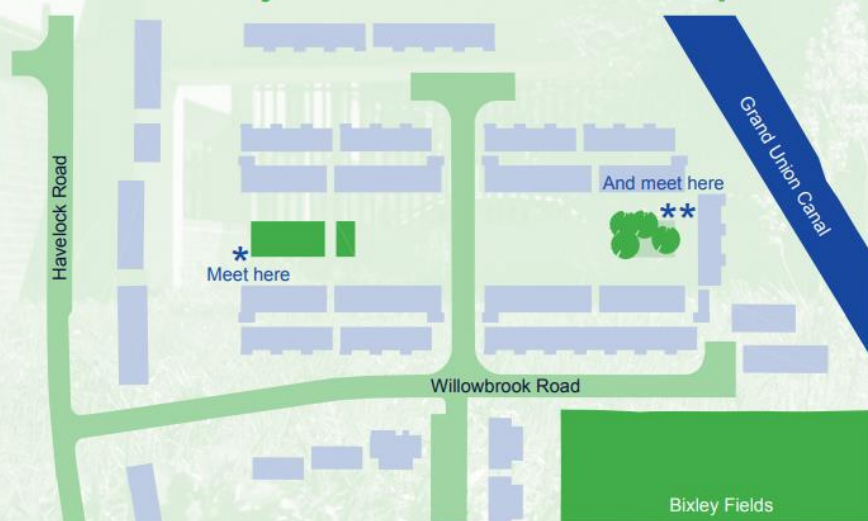

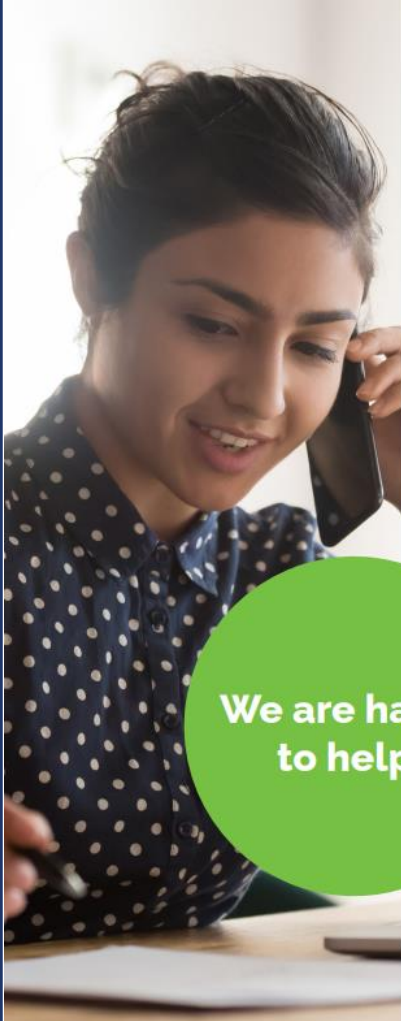
