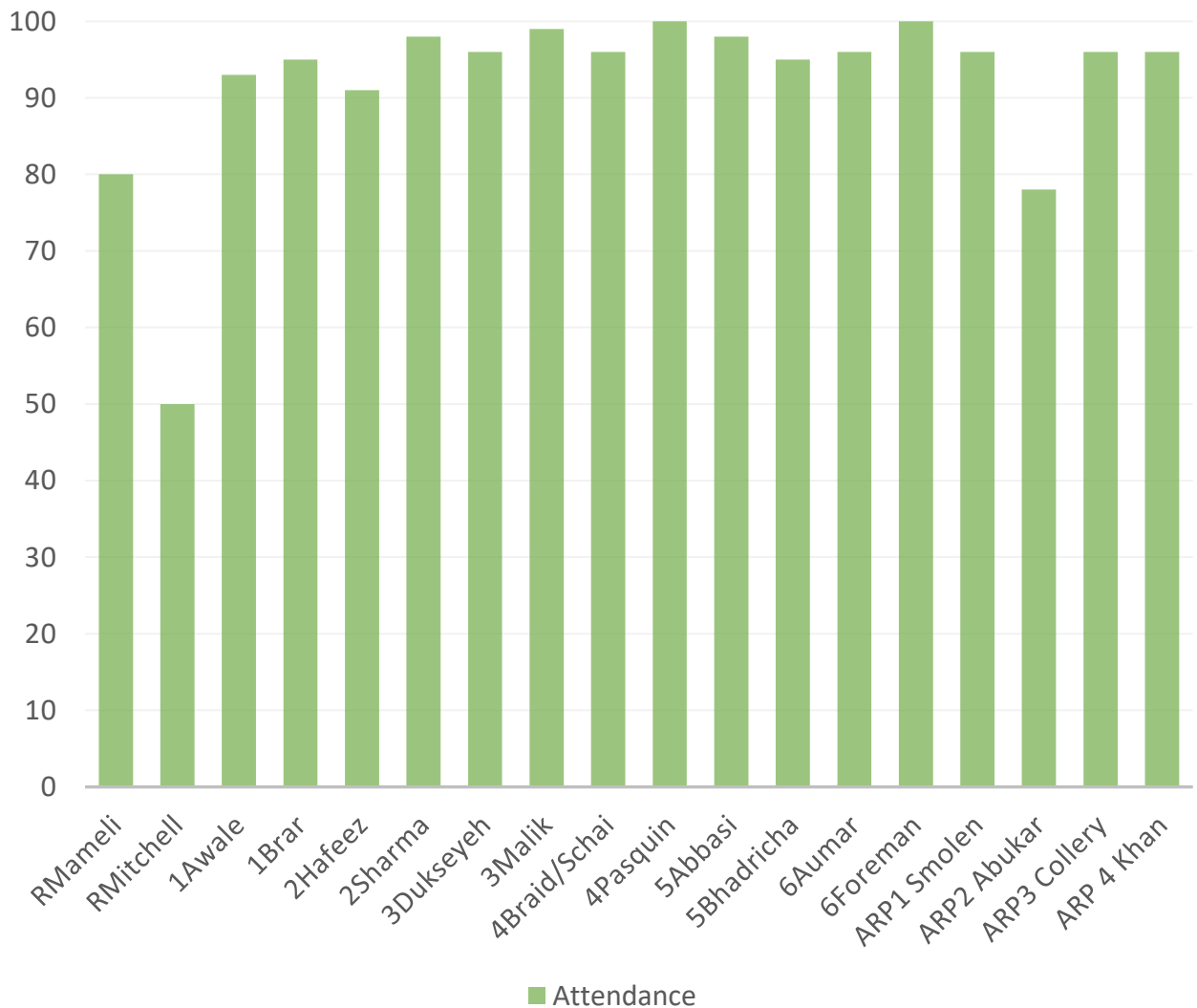
Attendance at Havelock

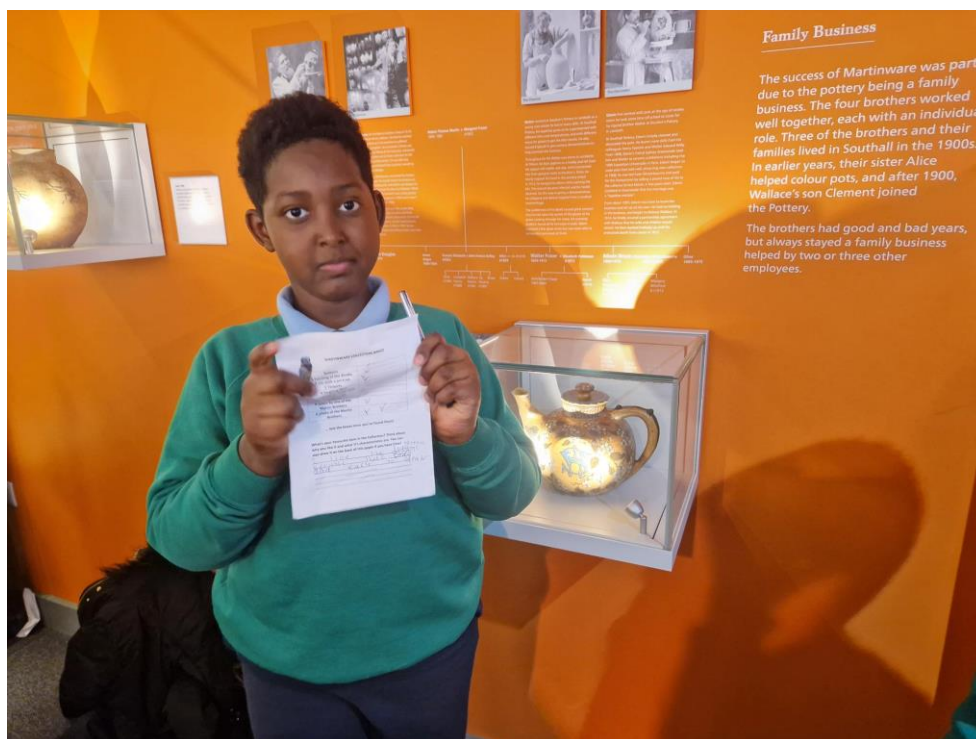
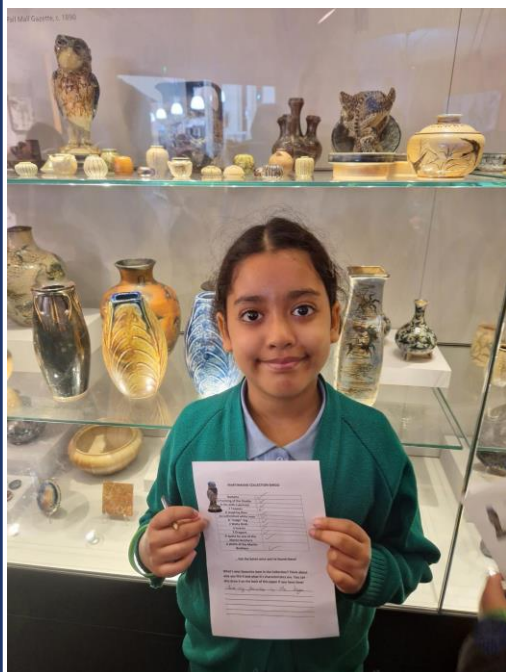
Year 4 and 6 Trip

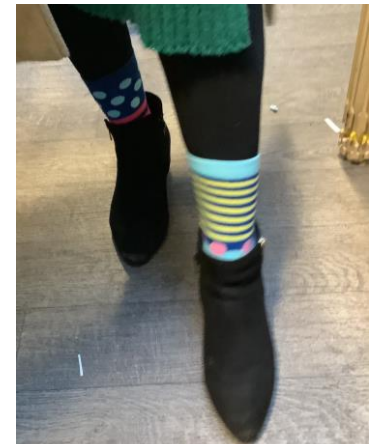
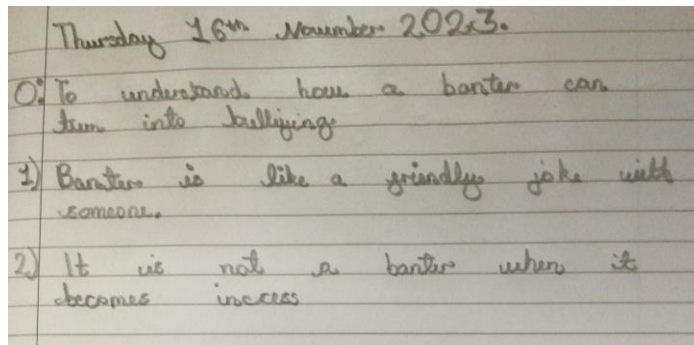

In PSHE lessons, children learnt about how they can make a noise and stand up against bullying.

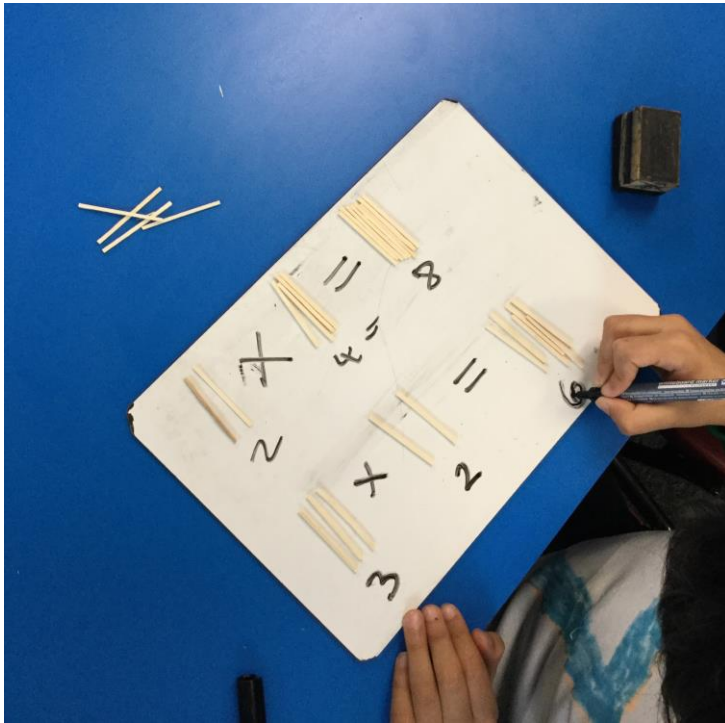

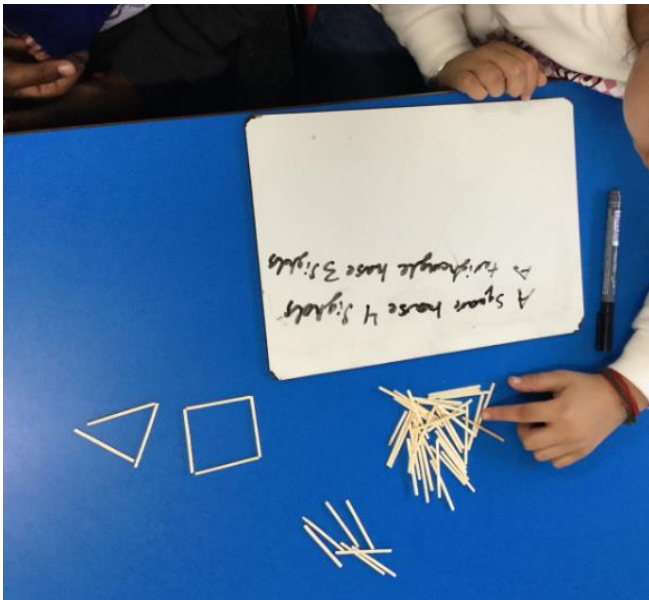
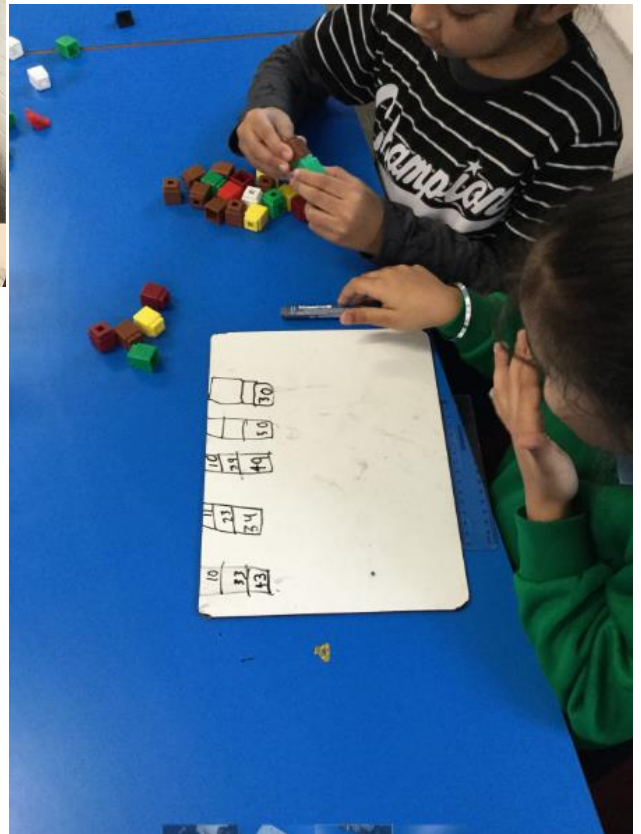
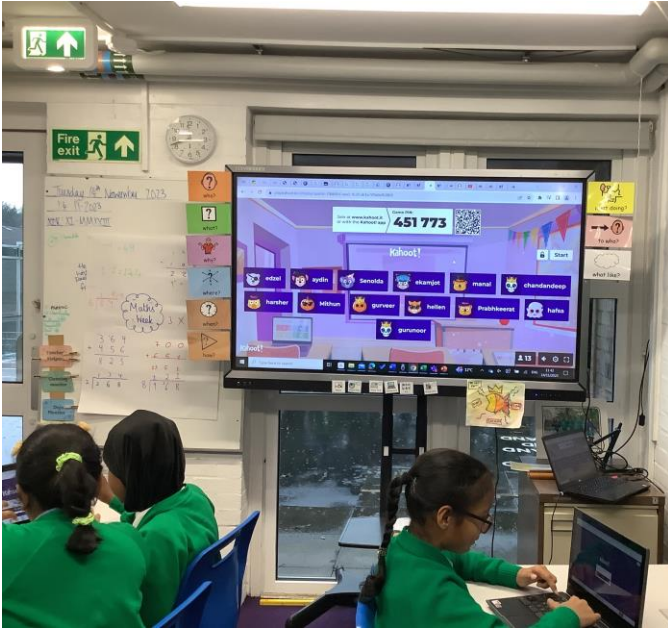
Monday 6th November- Friday 10th November

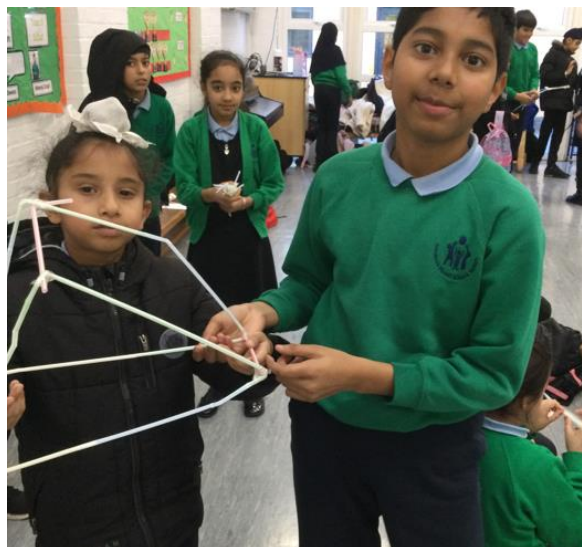

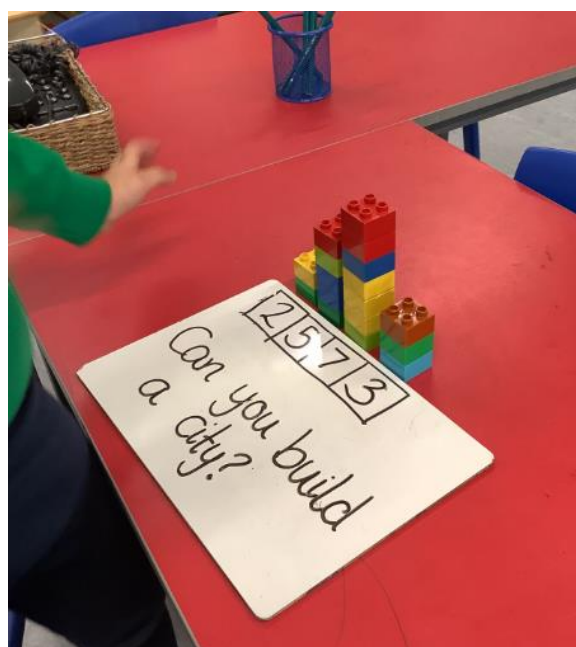

Readathon

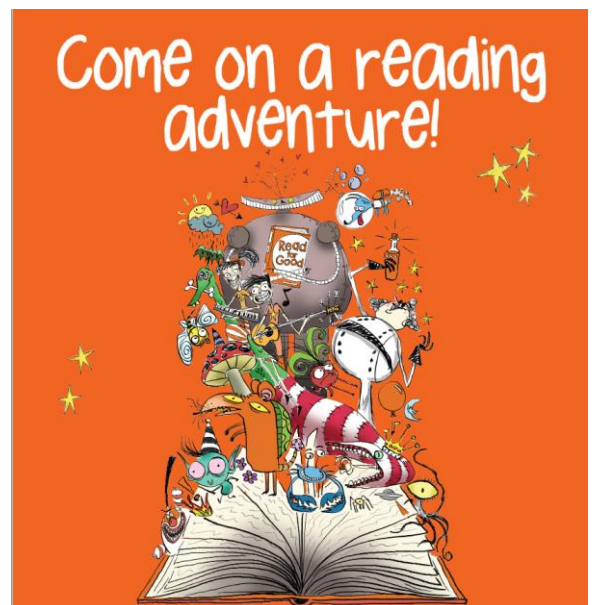

This week the children created space backgrounds, rockets and Earth in Art as it relates to our English text "Beegu". They focused on three continents when creating the planet Earth.

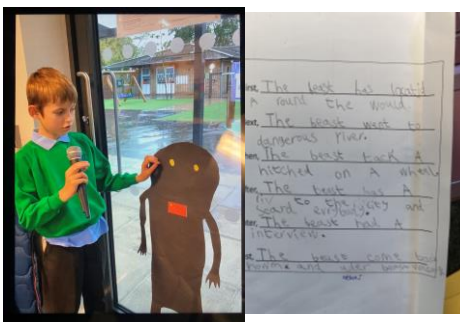
ARP 3

ARP 4

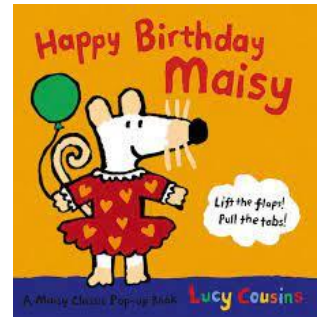



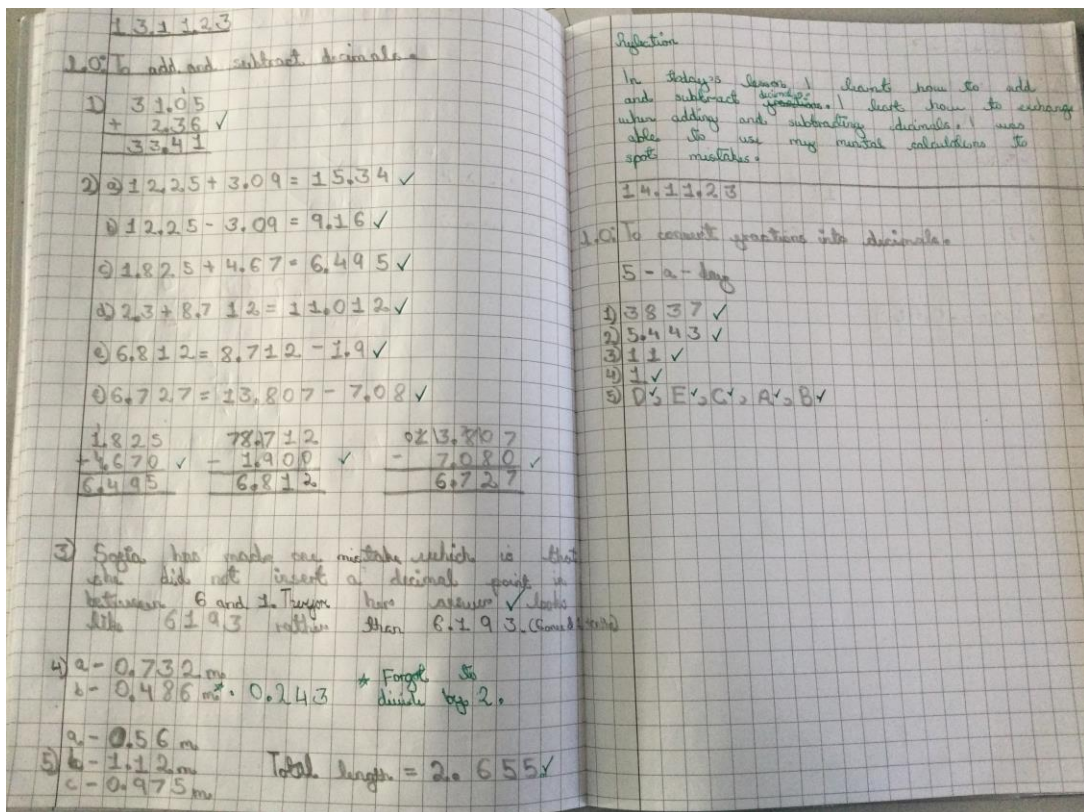

Maths at Havelock Year 6

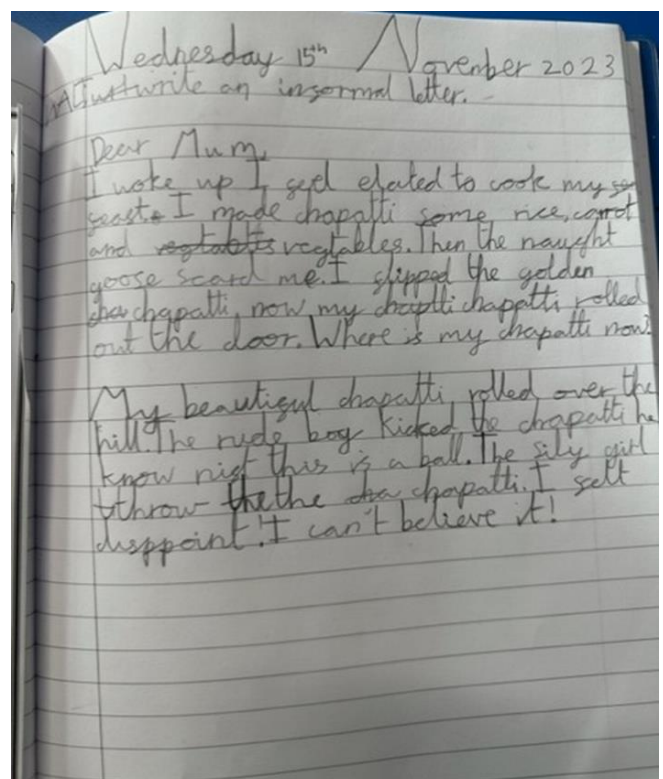
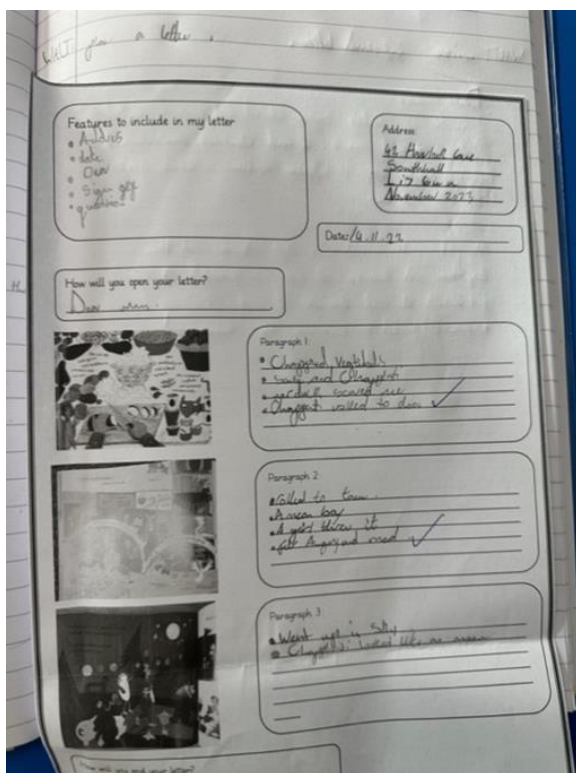

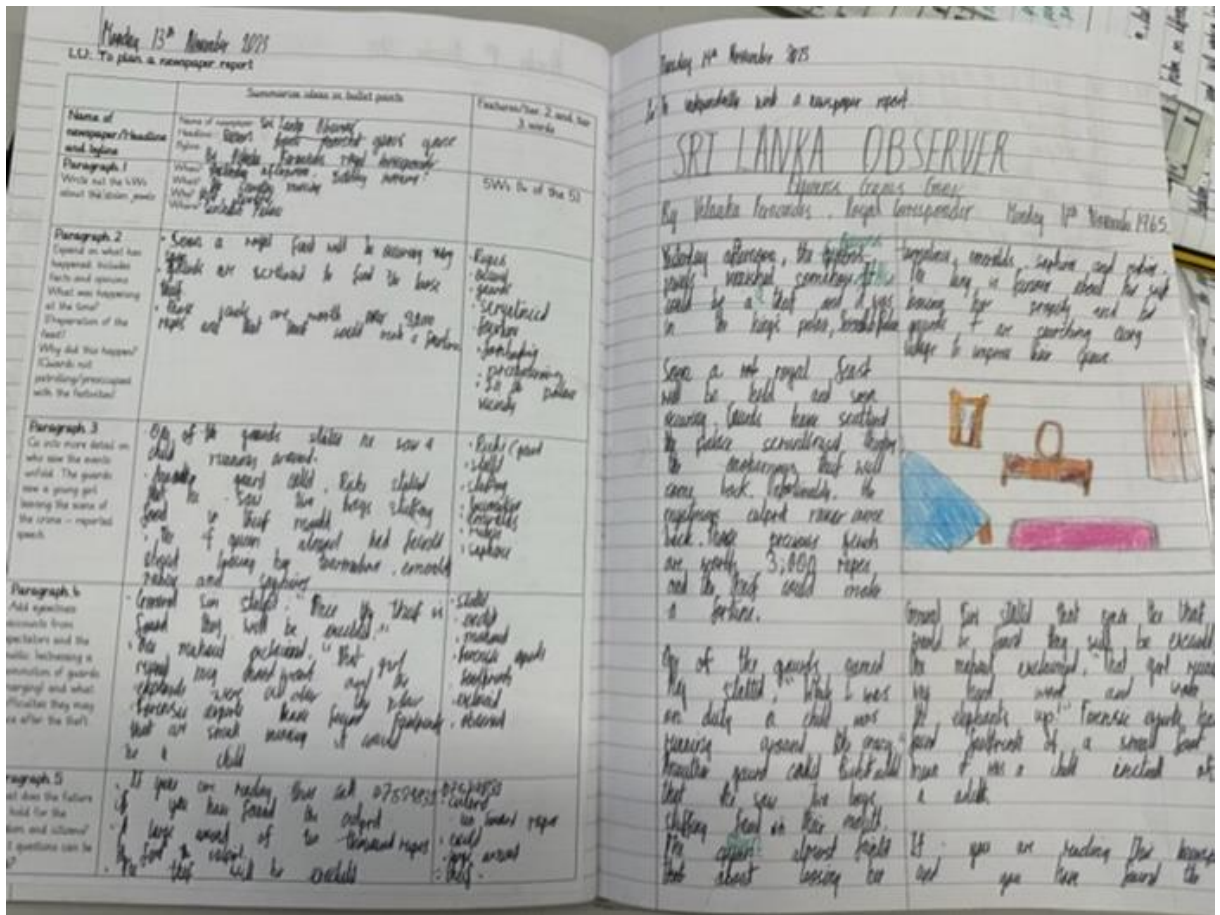

¿Qué sabes hacer?

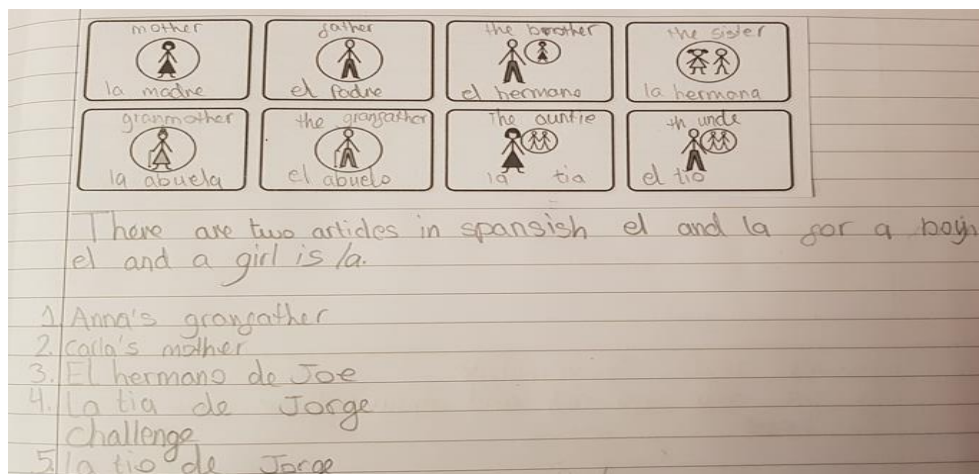

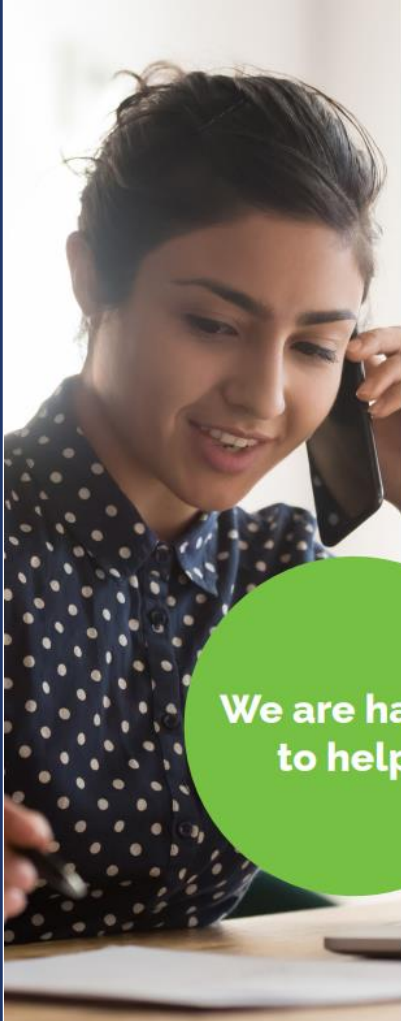
