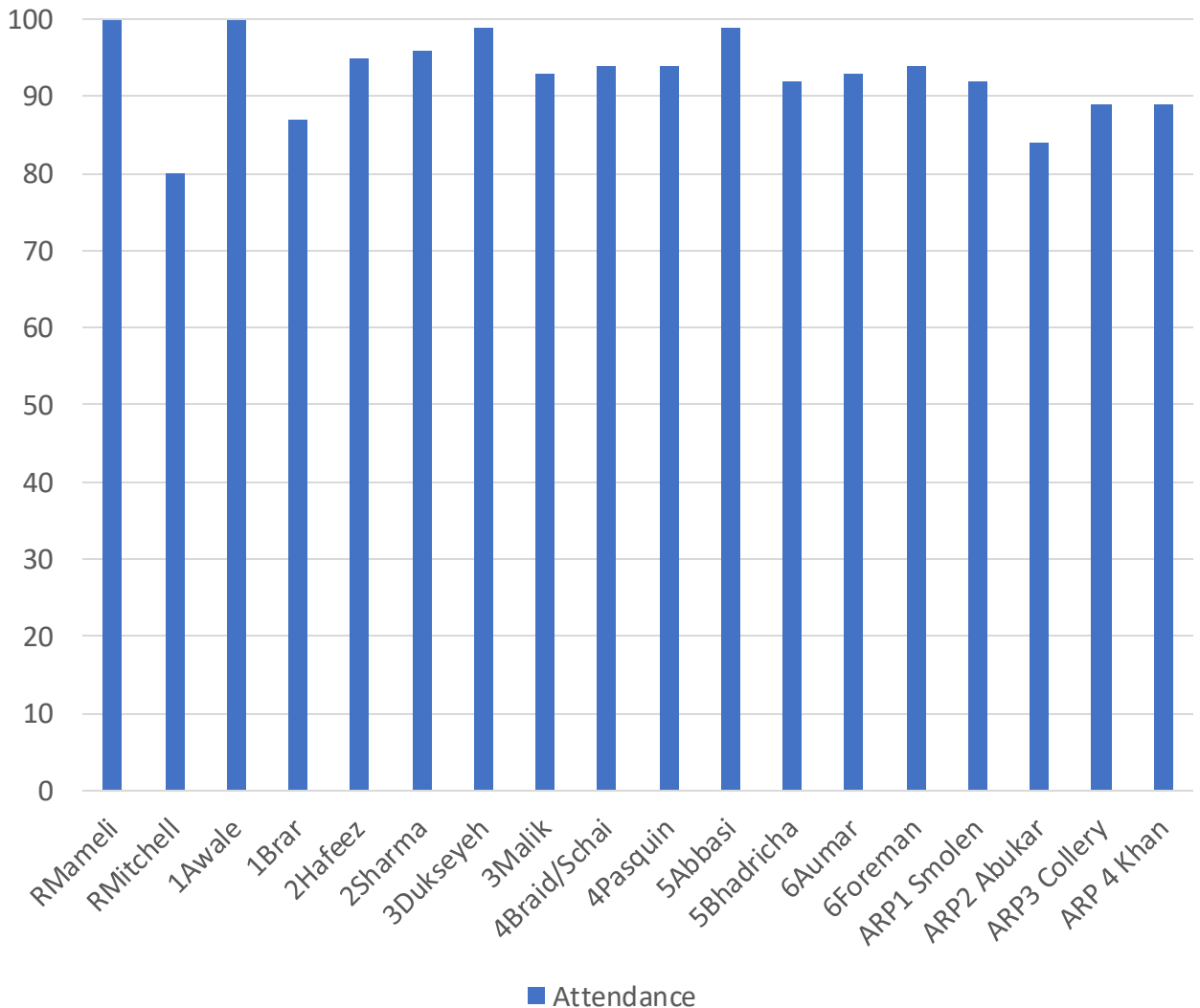


Attendance at Havelock

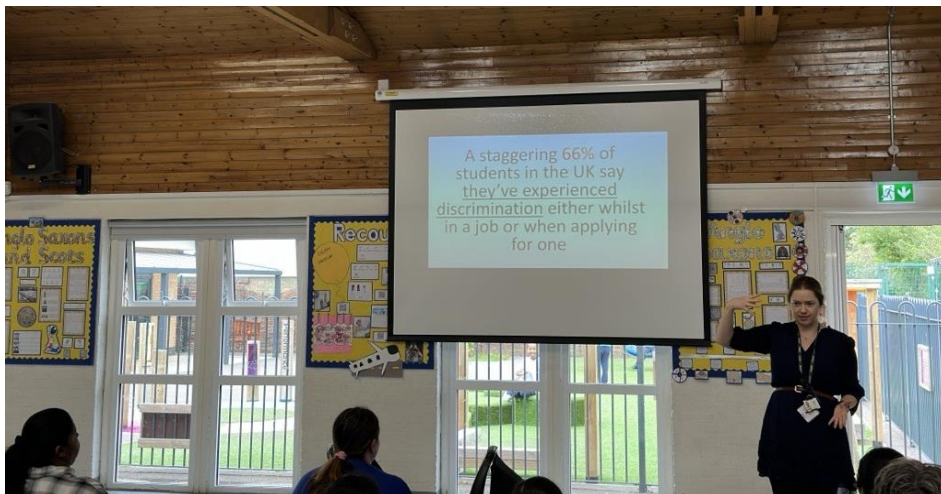
No Outsiders Parent Meeting

This week, ARP 2 have been learning about the story 'The Dark'. They made predictions about what they think the story might be about. They discussed what they could see on the front cover.

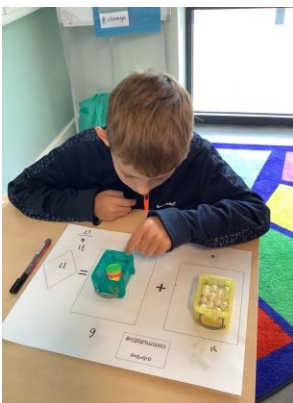
ARP3

ARP4

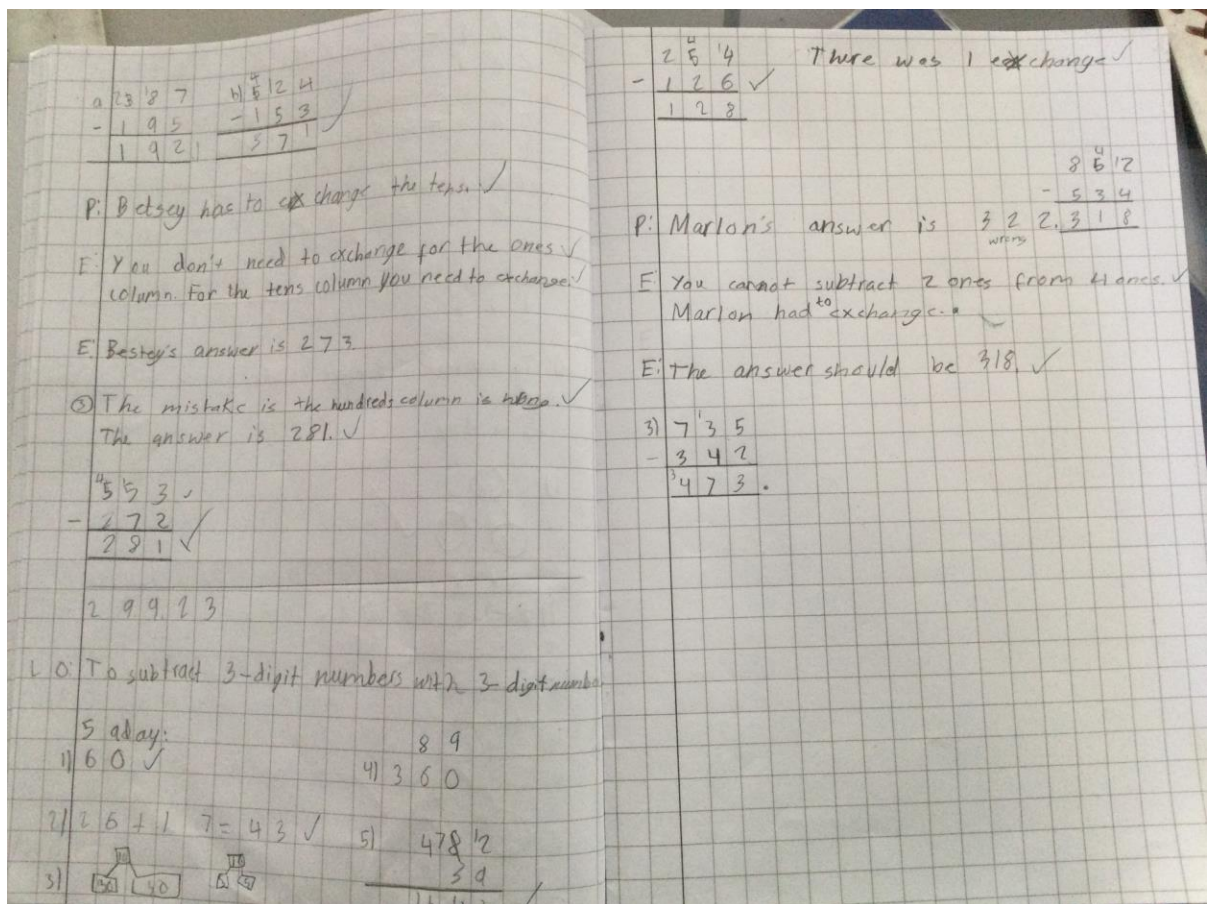
In maths, ARP 4 have been learning about addition. They learnt about the commutative law and used this to solve addition questions. They showed this using objects and explained why the answer was still the same.

Maths at Havelock Year 3

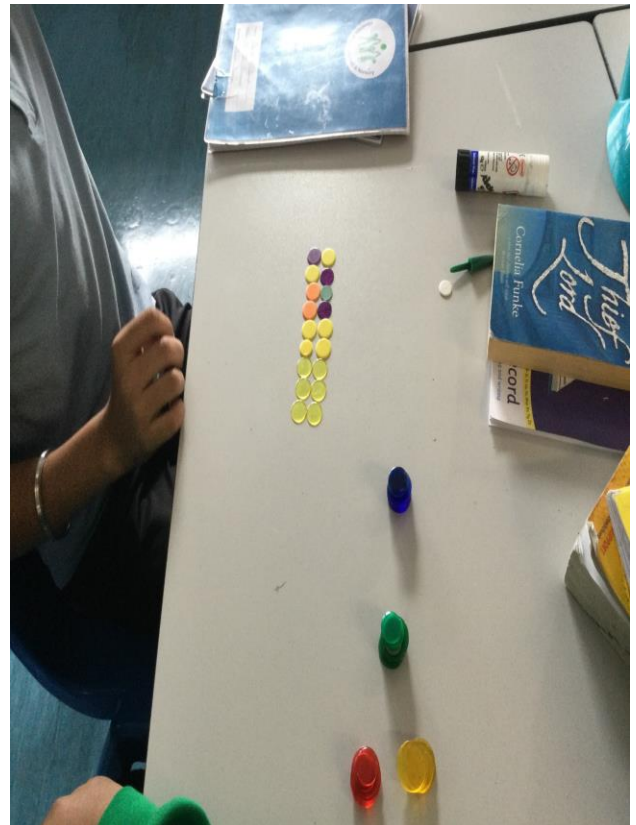
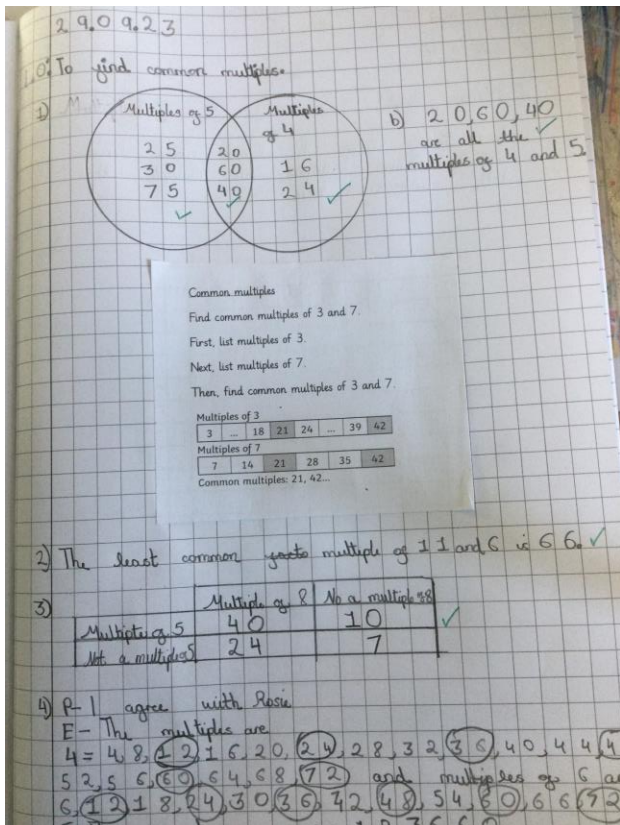
Year 3 have been progressing with their learning based on addition and subtraction. In their most recent lesson, they have been taught how to exchange.

Maths at Havelock Year 6

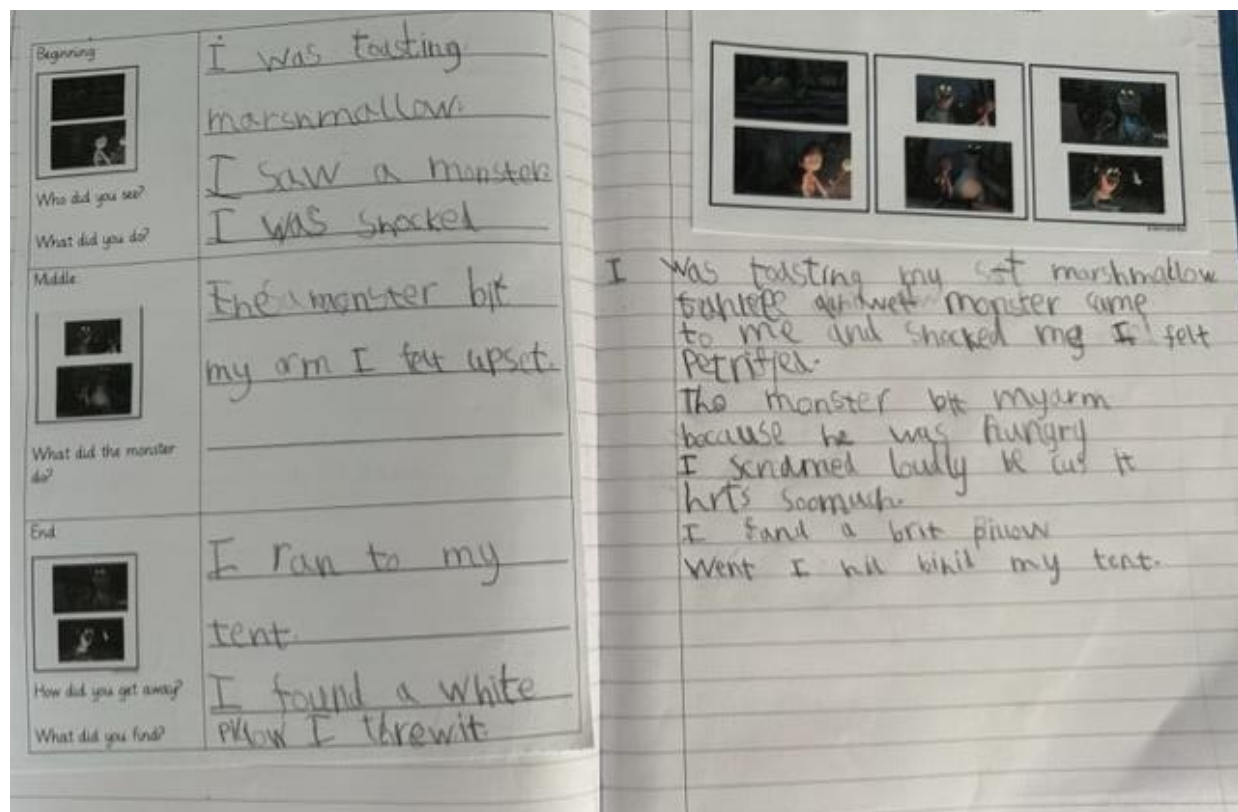
In year 6, pupils have been using concrete resources to find common factors and the lowest common multiple. They were able to use the vocabulary learnt in discussion to explain why someone may have a misconception.

Computing Year 2

Year 2 have started their Computing lessons by focusing on how to log in and how to stay safe online. Pupils spent time learning their Purple Mash log in's and discussed ways to stay safe online using the SMART rules.

 Never give out personal information to strangers on the internet. Personal information includes things like your home address and your birthday.

M IS FOR NEVER MEET
 Never ever meet up with a stranger you have met online unless a parent or guardian has said it is ok and is present. Never, never, never, never, never.

A IS FOR ACCEPTING
 Don't open emails from people you don't know, they could contain viruses. If you get a strange email from a friend and you think they might have a virus make sure you let them know!

R IS FOR RELIABLE
 Don't believe everything you read online, check your facts! Did you read it on a reliable website like the BBC? Are other websites saying the same thing? Does it tell you where they got the information from?

T IS FOR TELL
 If you have an online safety problem, make sure you tell someone. Tell a parent, guardian, or teacher as soon you can.

Computing Year 4

This term, Year 4 have been learning about online safety. Last week, they looked at 'phishing'. In addition, they looked at how fake emails can make you enter scam websites, and this is why we should never give out our personal information online.

Next week, they will be learning about the effect screen time can have on their health. They will complete a self- assessment on screen time and will consider how they can balance screen games with being active.



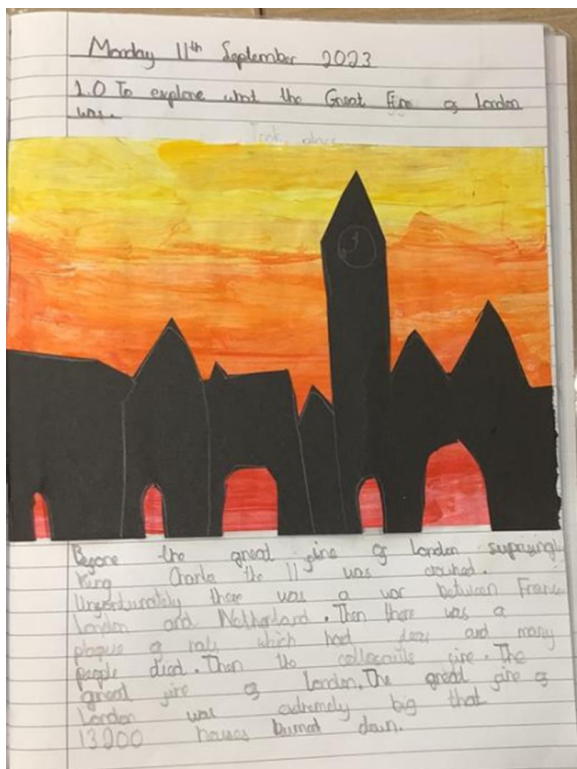

Class Assembly Year 5 Abbasi

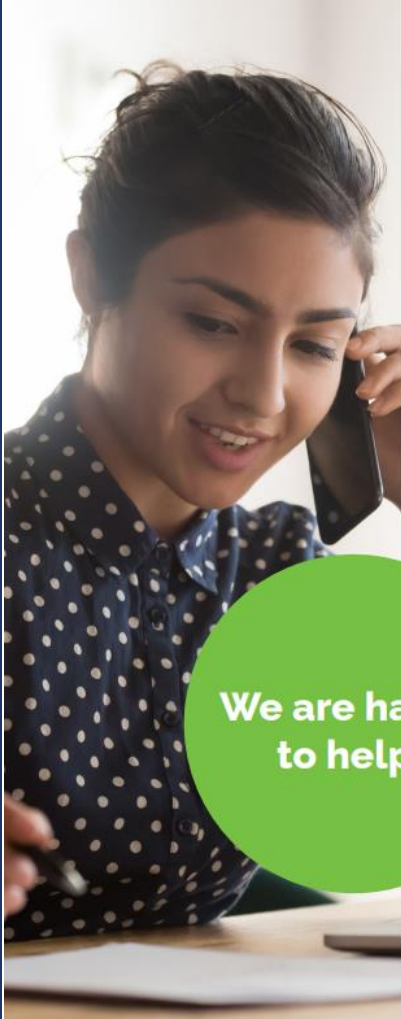
This week, 5Abbasi delivered their class assembly on History and Science.

Year 5 shared their learning about the Great Fire of London and what was happening in London in the lead up to the Great Fire in 1666 and what happened in the aftermath. They recounted the events in chronological order and also explored who could be to blame for the fire.

In Science, the children shared what they had learnt about the planets in the Solar System and how far the planets were from the sun in KM.
