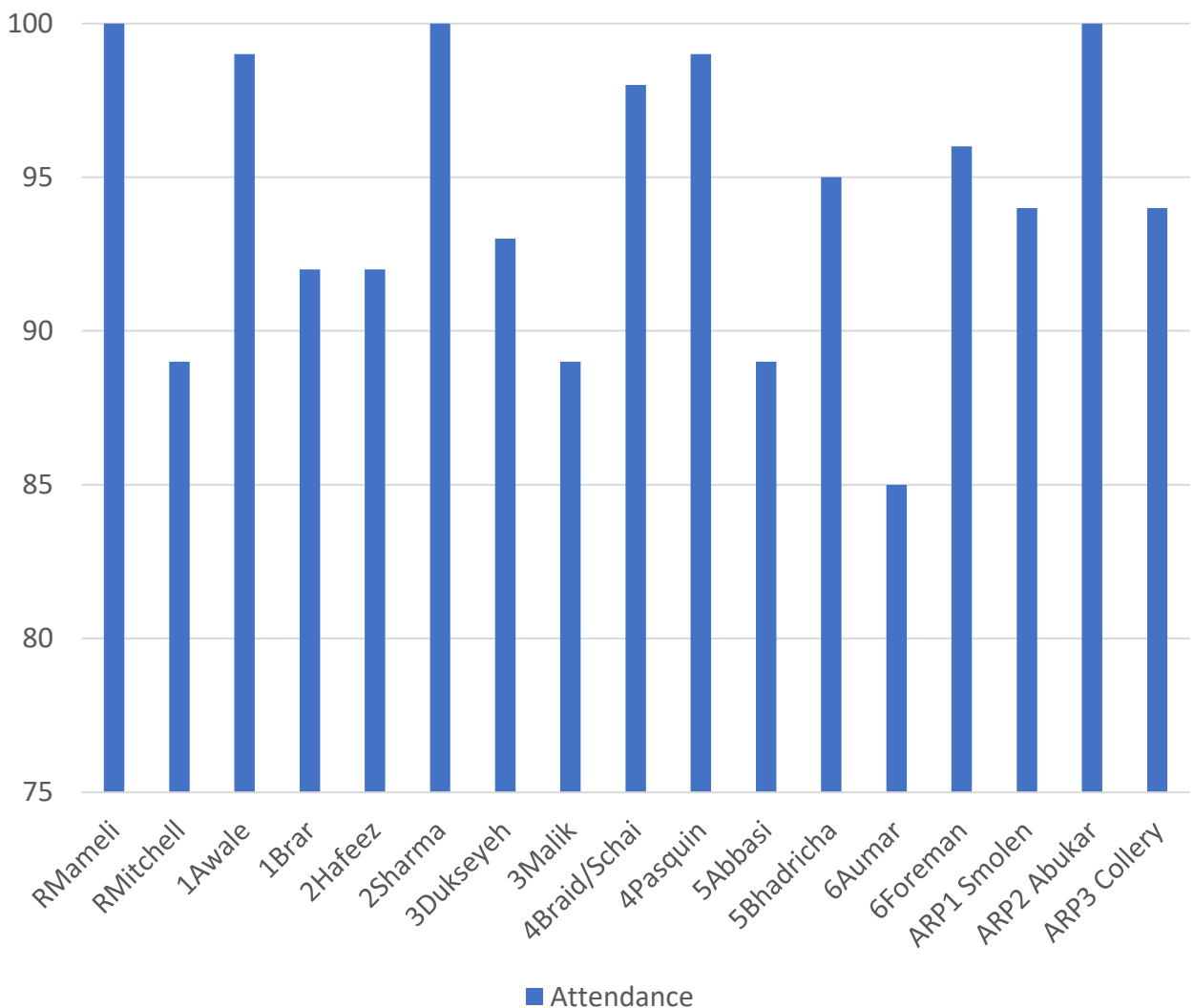


## Attendance at Havelock

This is an opportunity for parents to support one another and share expertise in various areas of life as well as find out different ways to support their children.

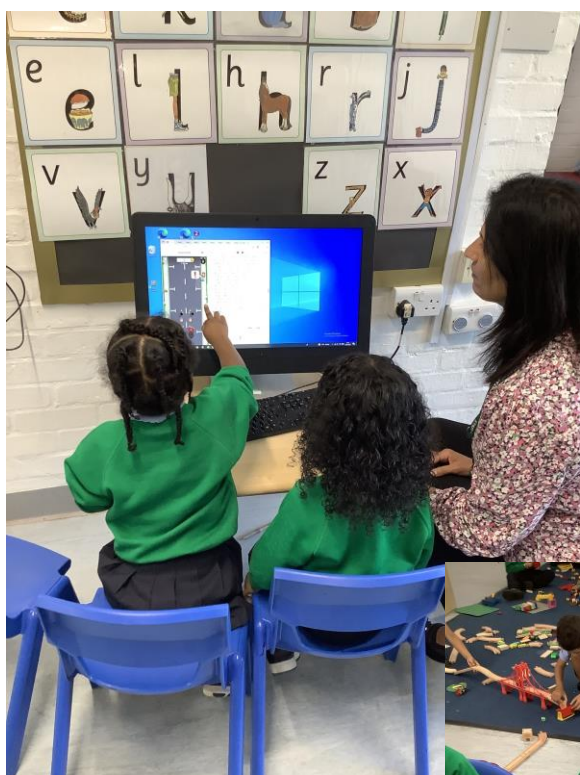

## EYFS at Havelock

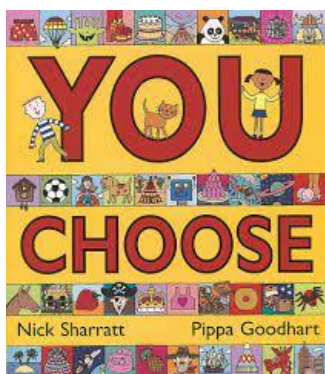
The Nursery and Reception children have settled in well, built relationships with familiar adults and made some new friends. The children have been learning about routines.

This week, ARP 1 have been learning about colours. They used tongs to sort different objects into the correct category.



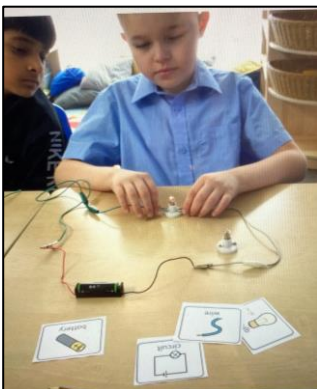
### ARP2

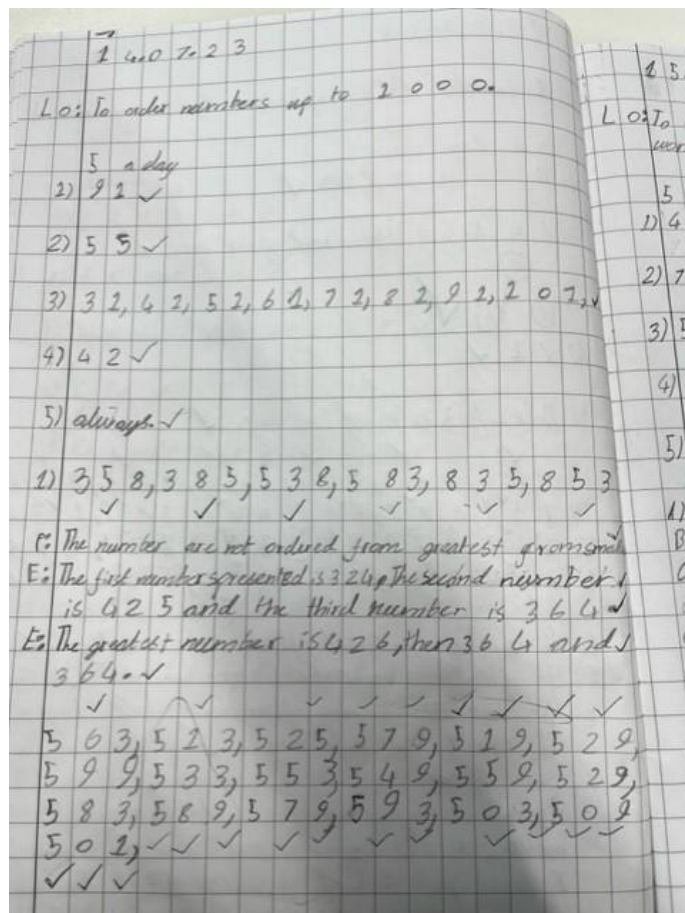
### ARP4

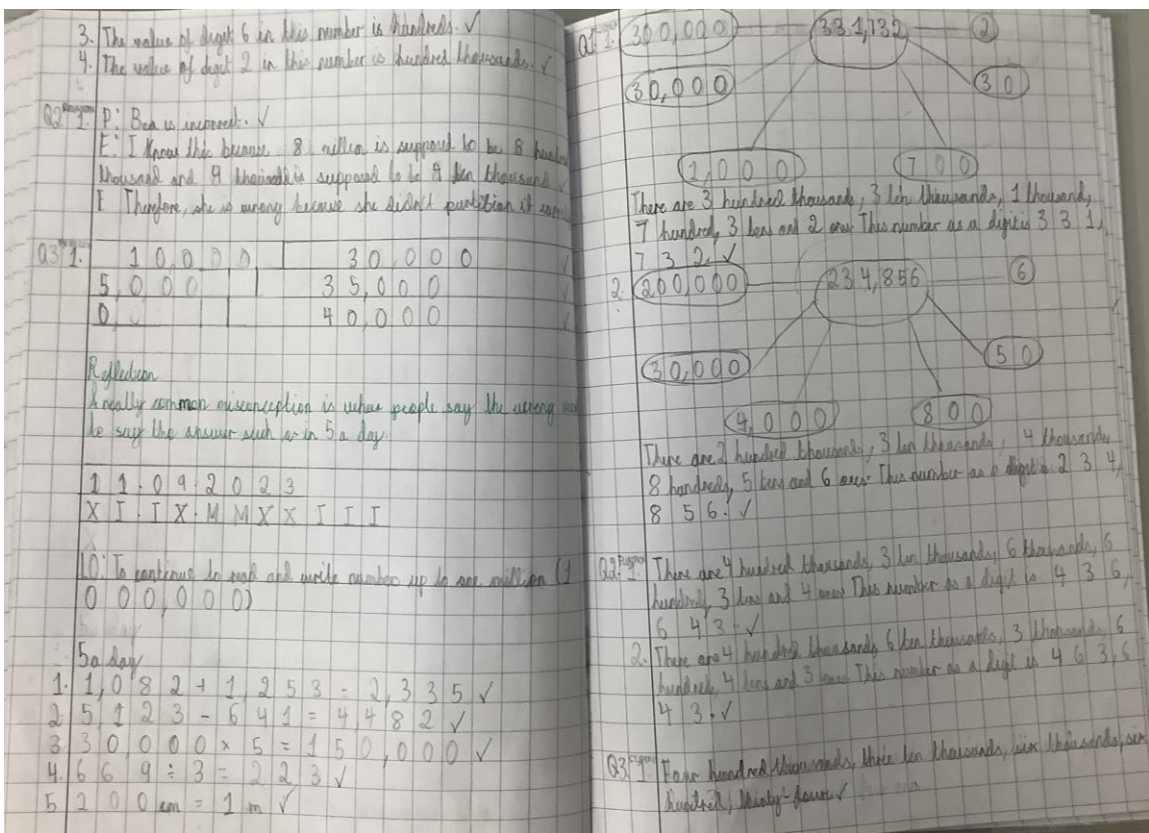

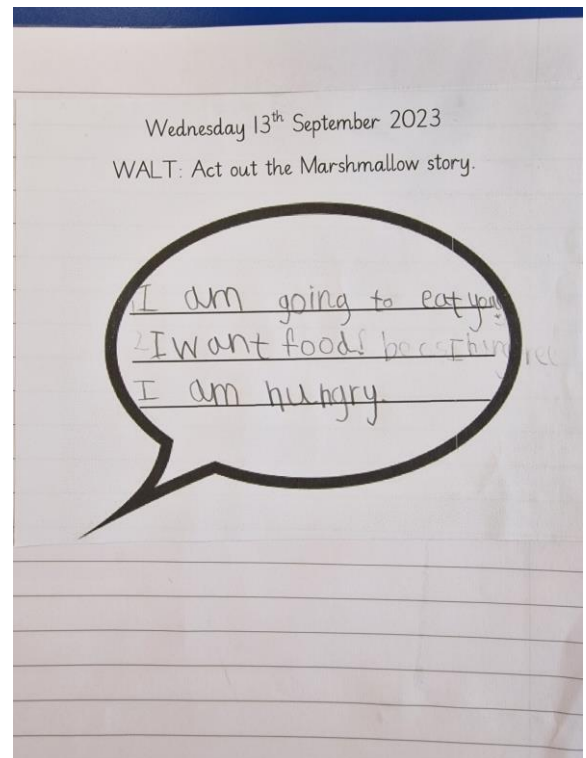
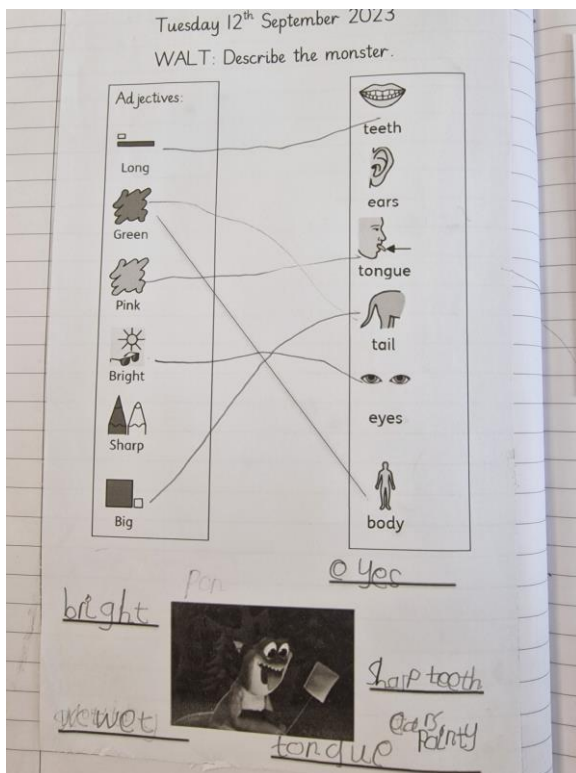

## History Year 6

This term, Year 6 have begun their unit on WW2. They have identified that The Blitz was a sustained campaign of aerial attacks on British towns and cities from September 1940-May 1941. This week the children have explored and researched the different strategies deployed by the government and civilians to protect themselves, including; Anderson shelters, ARP wardens, gas masks, a blackout and air raid sirens.

Monday 11th September 2023

LO: To explore what The Blitz was and identify how cities and civilians used to protect themselves.

What was The Blitz?

The Blitz is short for Blitzkrieg which means the "lightning war." The Germans attacked and bombed Britain, hence everyone in Britain, including London, had to be evacuated and sent to the nearest underground station. Hitler was responsible for the ~~war~~tactic because he set up a campaign to drop bombs overboard from a Luftwaffe. The Blitz ~~occured~~ occurred in 1940 and to alert everyone, they used an air-raid siren. Germany struck London, Liverpool and Coventry. ~~Evacuees~~ Evacuees' and civilians' homes were destroyed because ~~Germany~~ Britain was defenceless and had bombs to raid and create a blackout. The Blitz was also a tactic used to strike.

Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September 2023

LO: To explore what The Blitz was and identify how civilians and cities protected themselves.

What was The Blitz?

The Blitz (short for Blitzkrieg) was about Germany bombing Britain and this is because the British bombed Berlin, which is the capital city of Germany, to lower their defences. The Blitz was a German bombing campaign against the UK. Blitz or Blitzkrieg in English is lightning war. The attacks were authorised by Germany's chancellor Adolf Hitler. There was a large raid on 29<sup>th</sup> December 1940 resulting a fire storm known as the second Great Fire of London. People in the UK were alerted by sirens and had to go into hiding in places such as under ground tunnels, basements with people slept on and in the underground tunnels, they would have to sleep on the train tracks. This started on 7 sep 1940 to 11 May 1941.

This week, 6Aumar delivered their class assembly on English and Art.

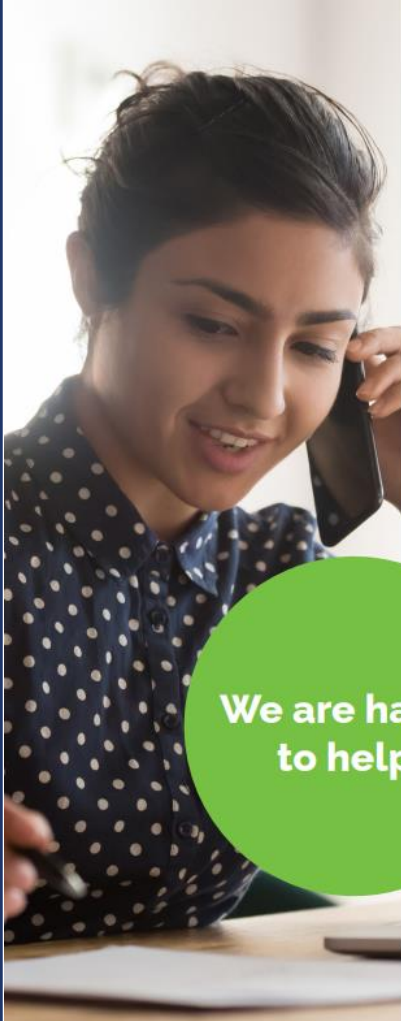
Year 6 pupils read out their independent writing based on the short animation The Piano and demonstrated their singing skills of the song they've been learning through Charanga lessons.
