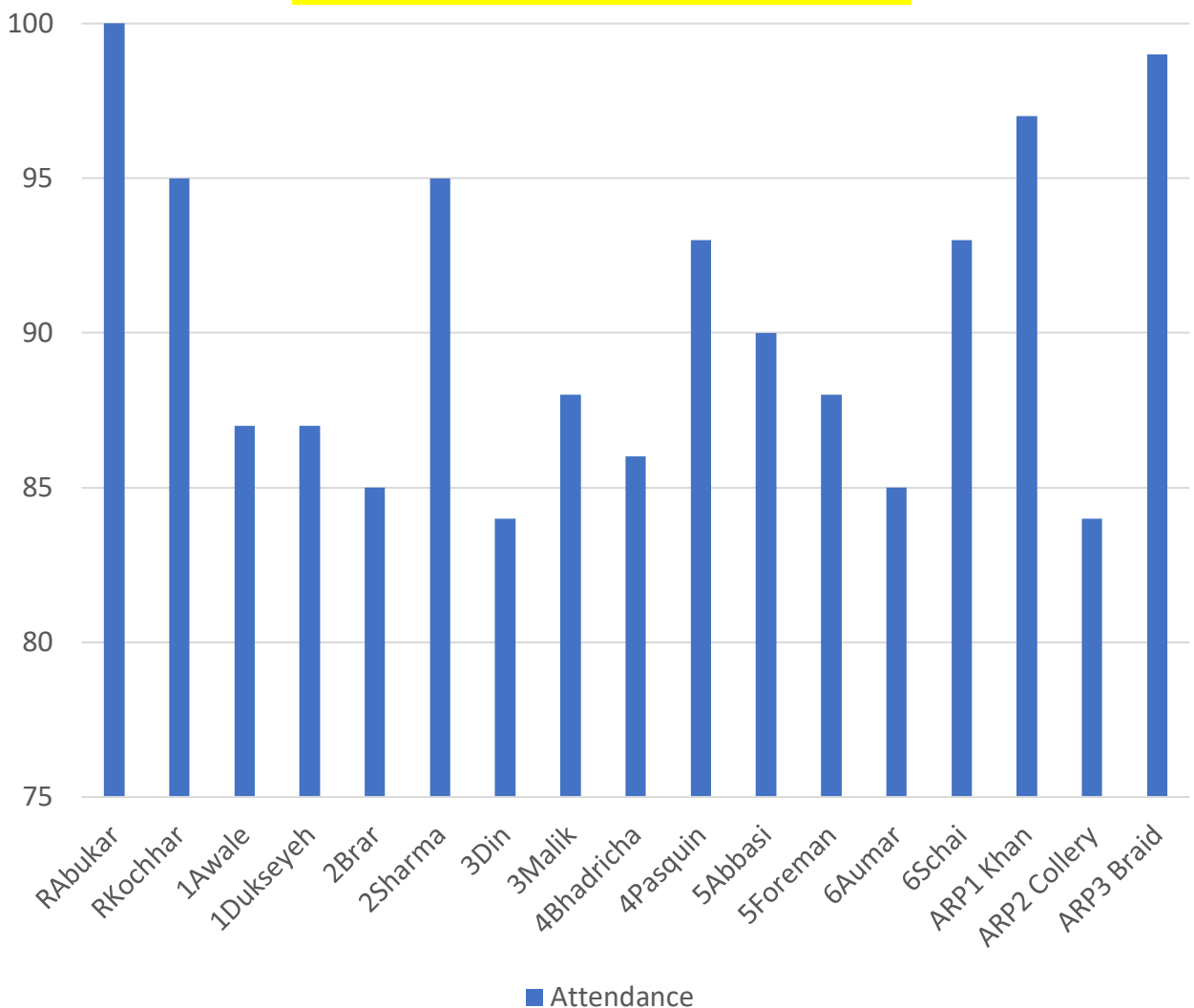
Attendance at Havelock

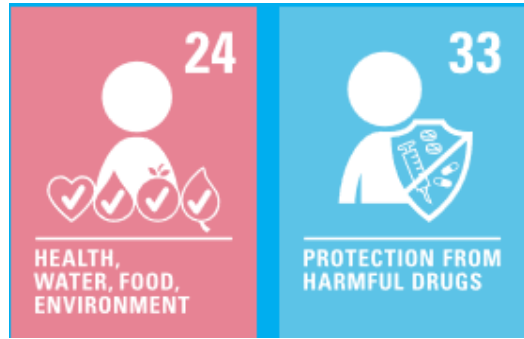

5R of the week : Build relationships

As part of their RE lesson, year 4 took part in an oracy task: conscience alley. One pupil walked down the alley, whilst listening to advice given by his peers based on his moral dilemma. Pupils worked collaboratively to produce a range of ideas. They also showed mutual respect to one another by showing proof of listening, waiting for their turn and understanding each other's viewpoints.



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Year 6 Junior Citizens Trip

Year 6 children went on a trip to the Young Adult Centre and were taught how to keep safe. The police officers and fire brigades taught the students how to correctly use the “999” system and provided them scenarios to work through safely. They even had the opportunity to dress up as a police officer!



ARP Trip - London Eye



ARP classes 2 and 3 went on a trip to London Eye this week. They ventured underground via tube and train and then checked out the skies from the London Eye pods. They could identify Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, St Paul's Cathedral, the Shard and even Buckingham Palace! The children had an absolute blast, despite the train delays on the homeward journey!



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Year 1 Trip



On Monday 26th of June, the Year 1 pupils went on an incredible trip to London zoo as part of their learning for the topic 'Animals including humans'.

The pupils were amazed and in awe seeing powerful and exotic creatures in their habitats up close; from prowling tigers to waddling penguins-It was a joy to see their faces light up. Thank you to all the parents who helped on the day!

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Year 4 Trip

On Tuesday, Year 4 has visited Hampton Court Palace to observe the lifestyle of the Tudor Court at the time of Henry VIII.



We observed the utensils, pots and herbs used in a Tudor kitchen. We even pretended to enjoy a banquet at the top table like kings and queens!



We also explored the amazing grounds including the kitchen garden, gardener's shed and finally the incredible maze, which was the funniest part of the excursion.

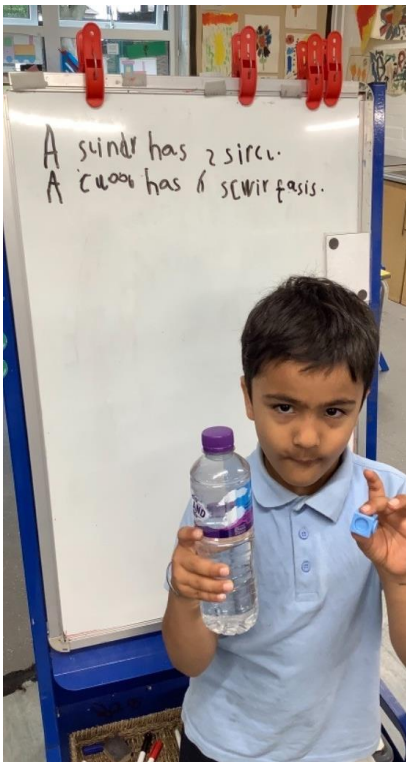

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EYFS at Havelock - Reception

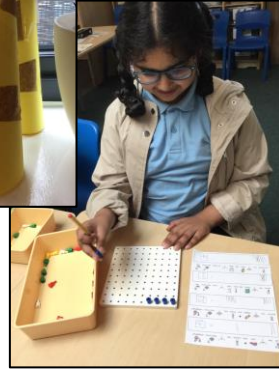
The children have been identifying 3D shapes inside and outside. They are beginning to describe the properties of 3D shapes by counting the faces and naming the 2D shape they can see.



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Havelock ARP

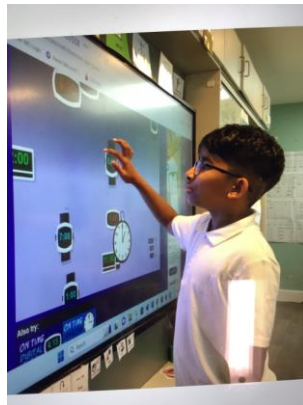
In ARP 1, children used resources to help solve simple word problems. We have also continued learning about Africa and children made some giraffes. A few also saw some real giraffes on their trip to London zoo!



This week, ARP 2 started a new book, *The Day the Crayons Quit*. They thought about why the crayons might be feeling angry and created their own crayon characters. In maths, they were learning about money- recognising the different British coins and making amounts. In science, they investigated the properties of different materials- asking if they would float or sink.



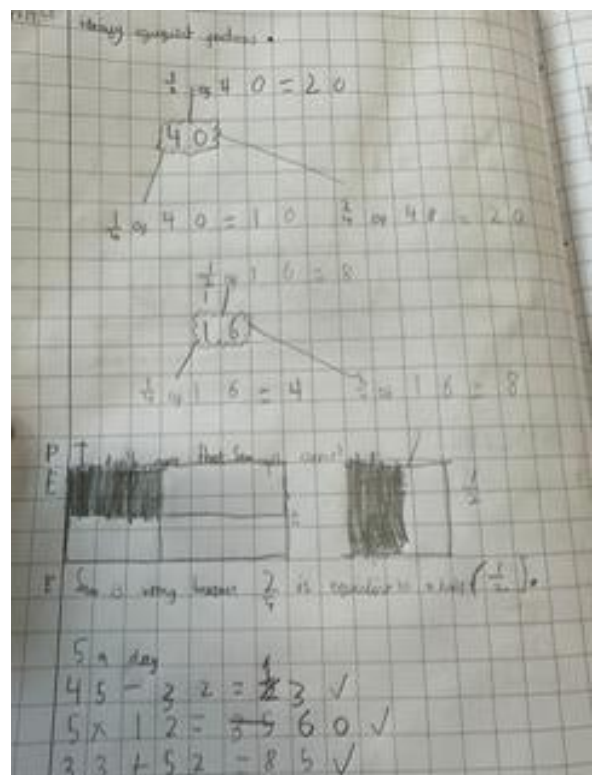
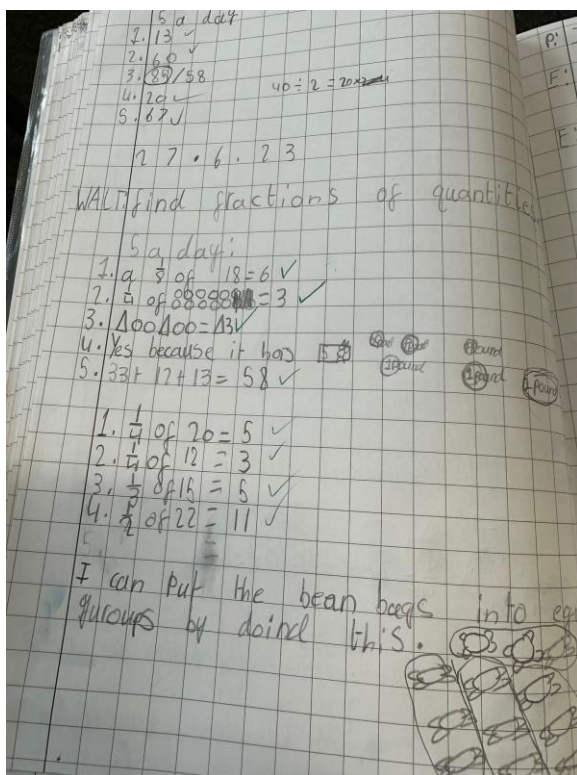
ARP 3 have been learning about time in maths. They have focused on o'clock and half past. Children made some wonderful cards to celebrate Eid.

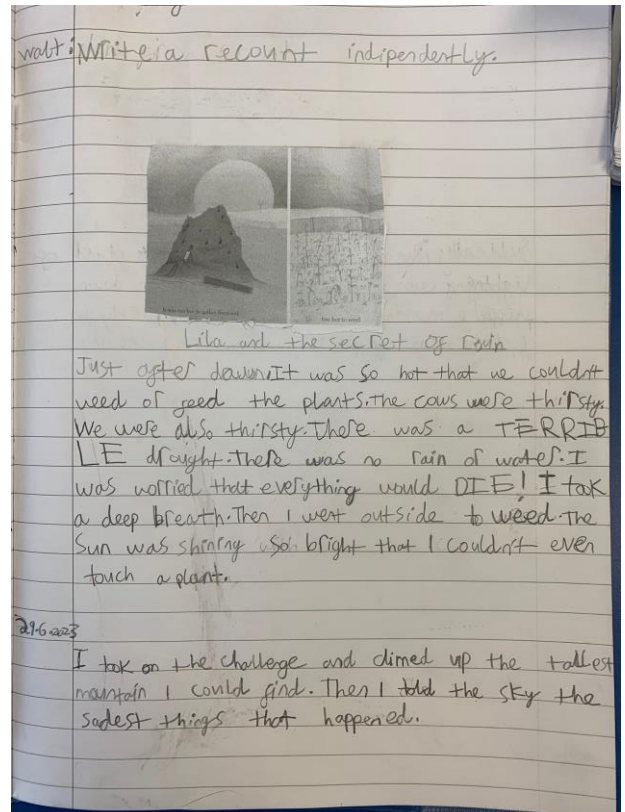
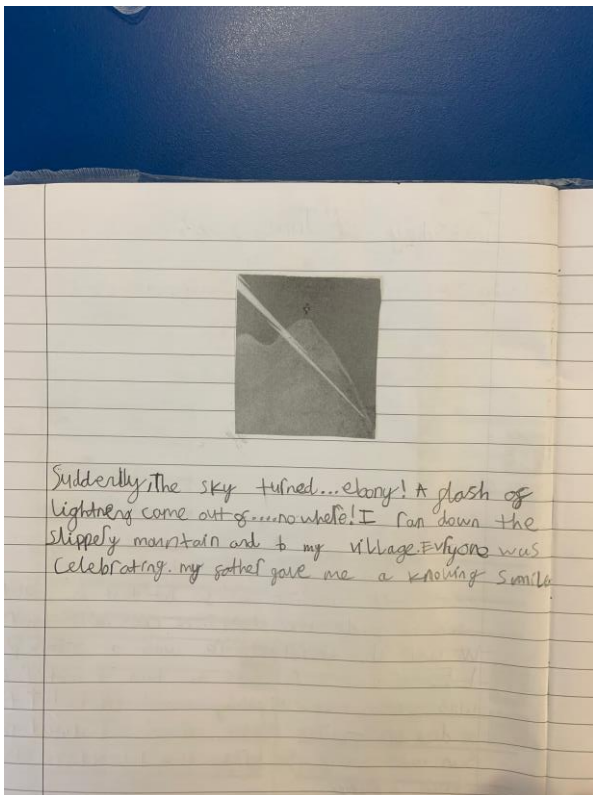

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English at Havelock Year 3

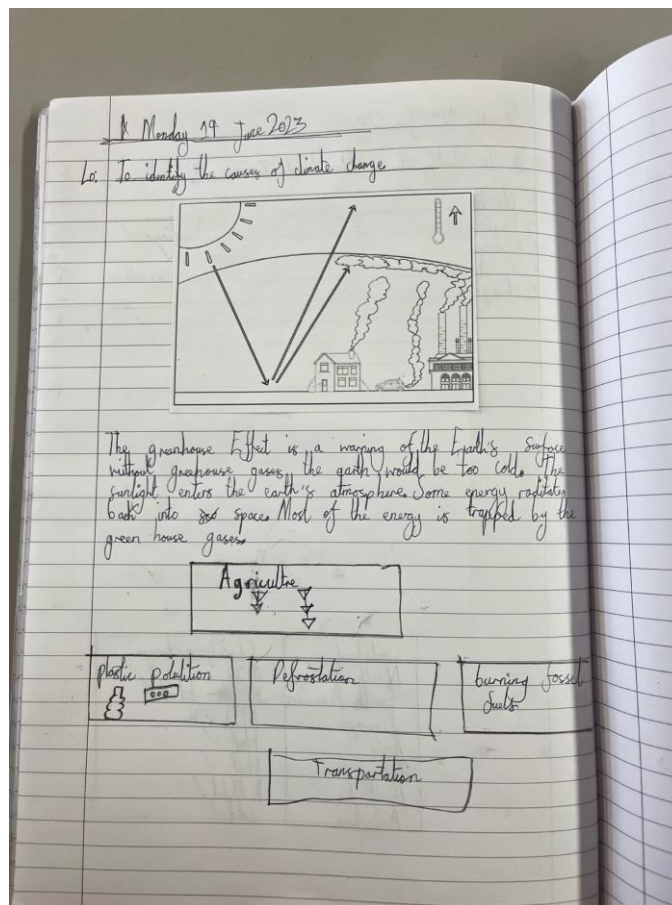

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Geography Year 4

Pupils have been looking at the different causes of climate change. They were involved in an oracy task and a diamond activity where they had to rank which was the most important cause to prevent.



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Geography Year 6

Year 6 pupils have been looking at the life cycle of a river. They were acting out the different parts of the cycle and matched the vocabulary. This had helped them to understand the meaning of tier 3 vocabulary and explain how rivers can change landscape.

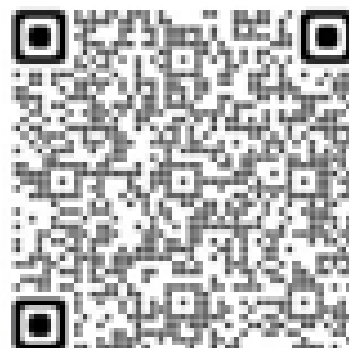
