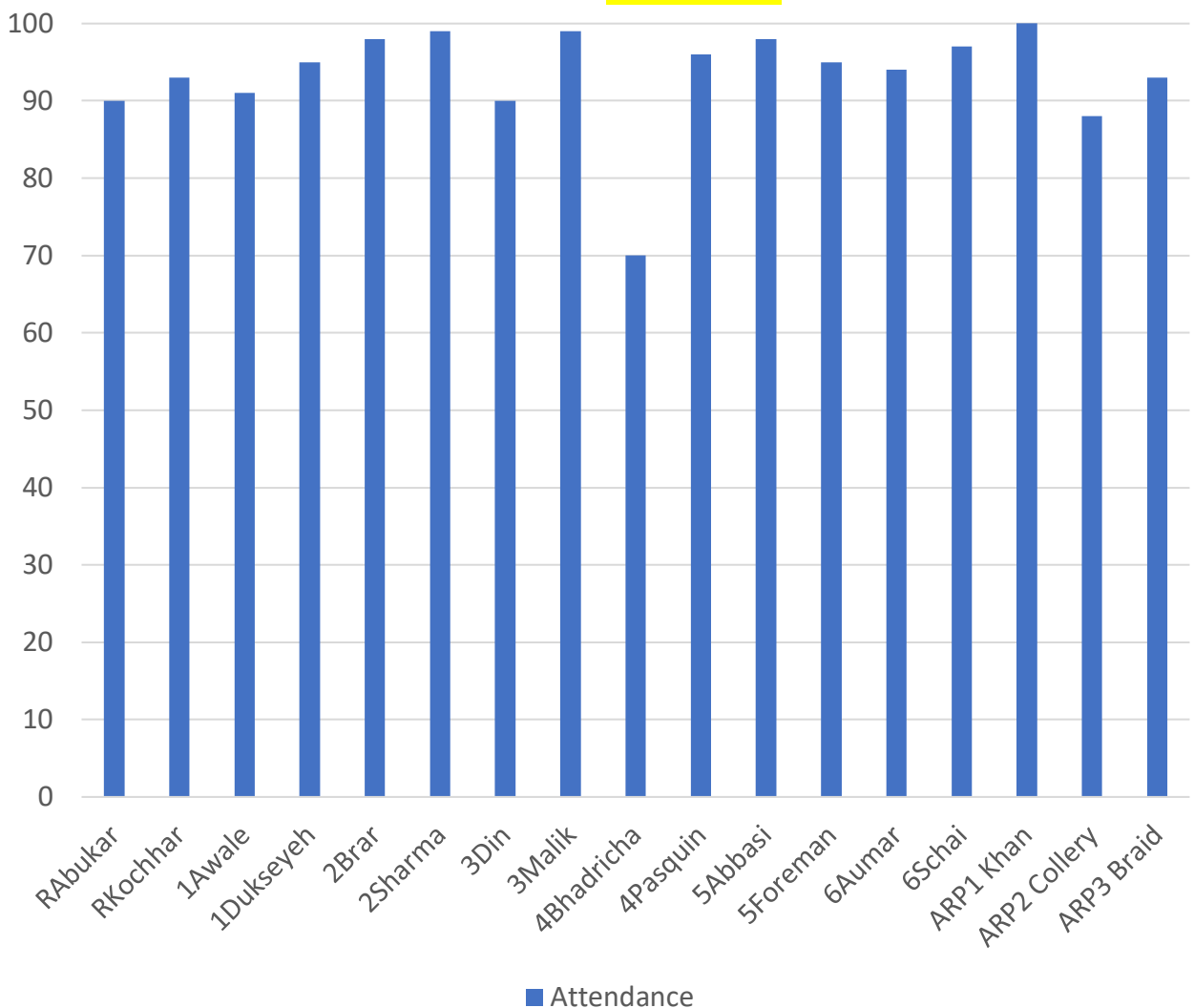

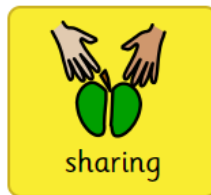

Article 15 is about children having the **opportunity** to gather with others for different purposes.

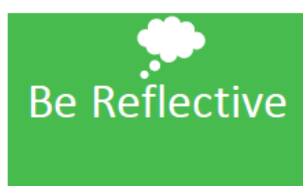
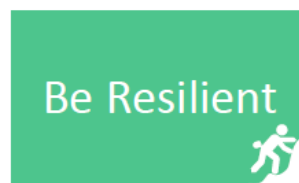
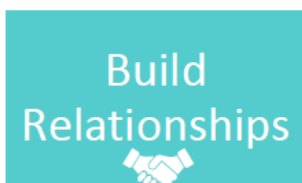
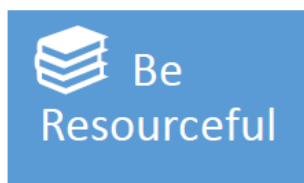

This week, year 5 are studying a new text called 'Son of the Circus,' which is based on a true story set in Victorian Britain.

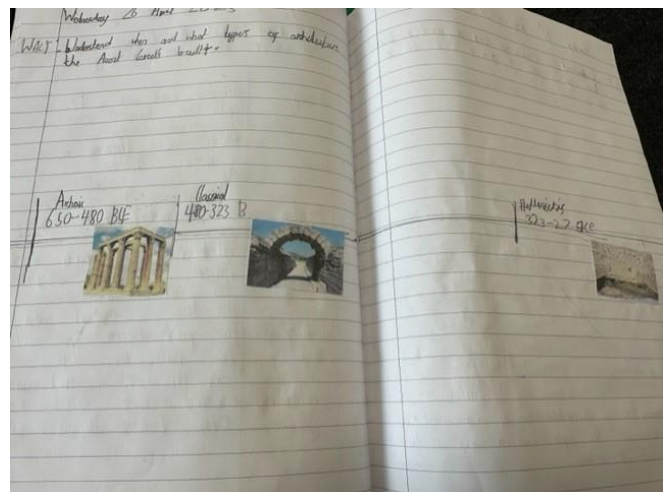
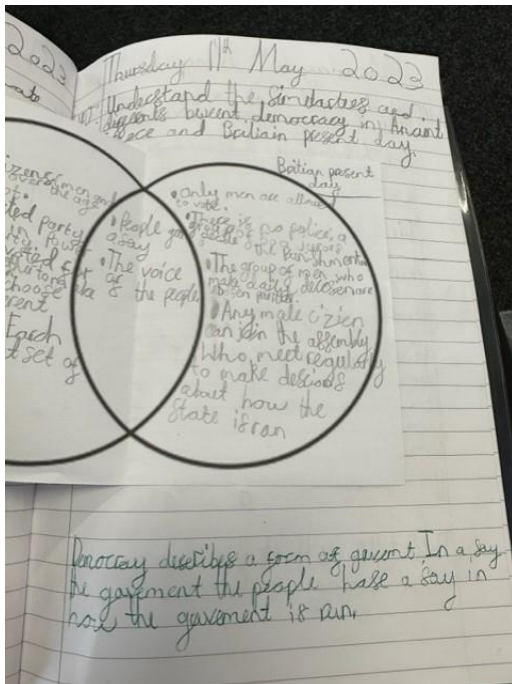

History Year 2

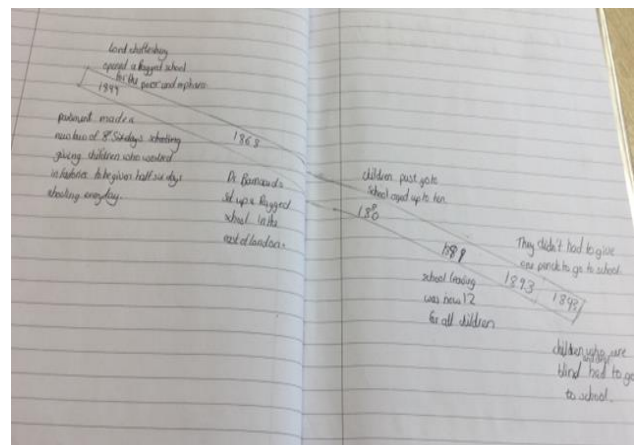
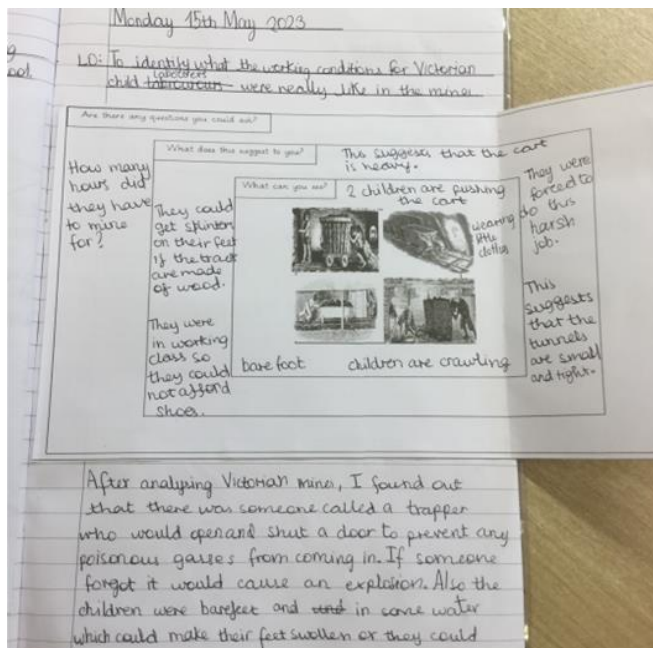

They have also spent time chronologically placing Ancient Greek architecture (columns, stadiums and amphitheatres) on a timeline.

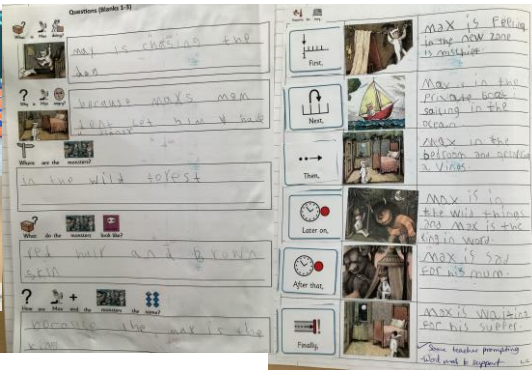

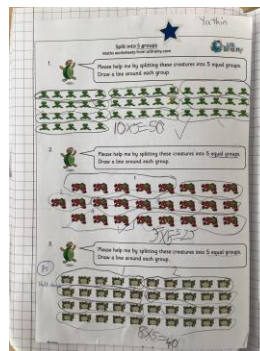
Havelock ARP

Year 5 Trip

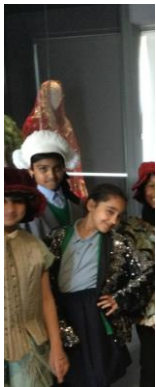

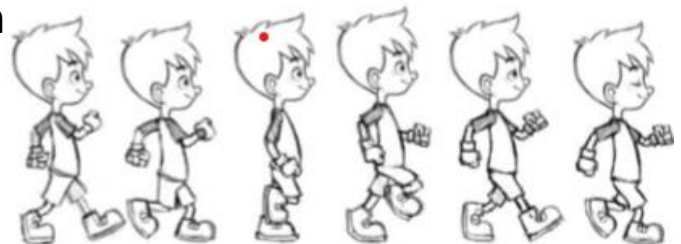
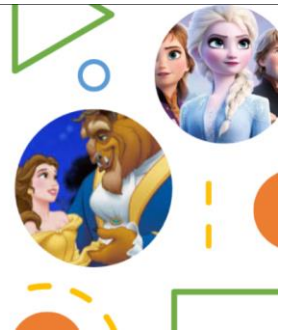
Class Assembly Year 4

WHAT IS IT?

Caring Dads provides a 17-week parenting course for fathers who are in contact with their children or have the expectation of being in contact with them.

It is a cognitive behaviour therapy programme for up to 16 fathers and is delivered by trained facilitators with a background in child development or offender management.

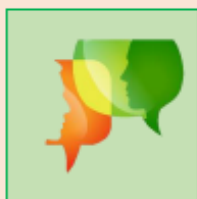

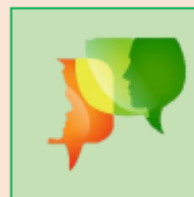

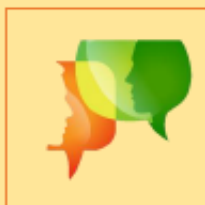
