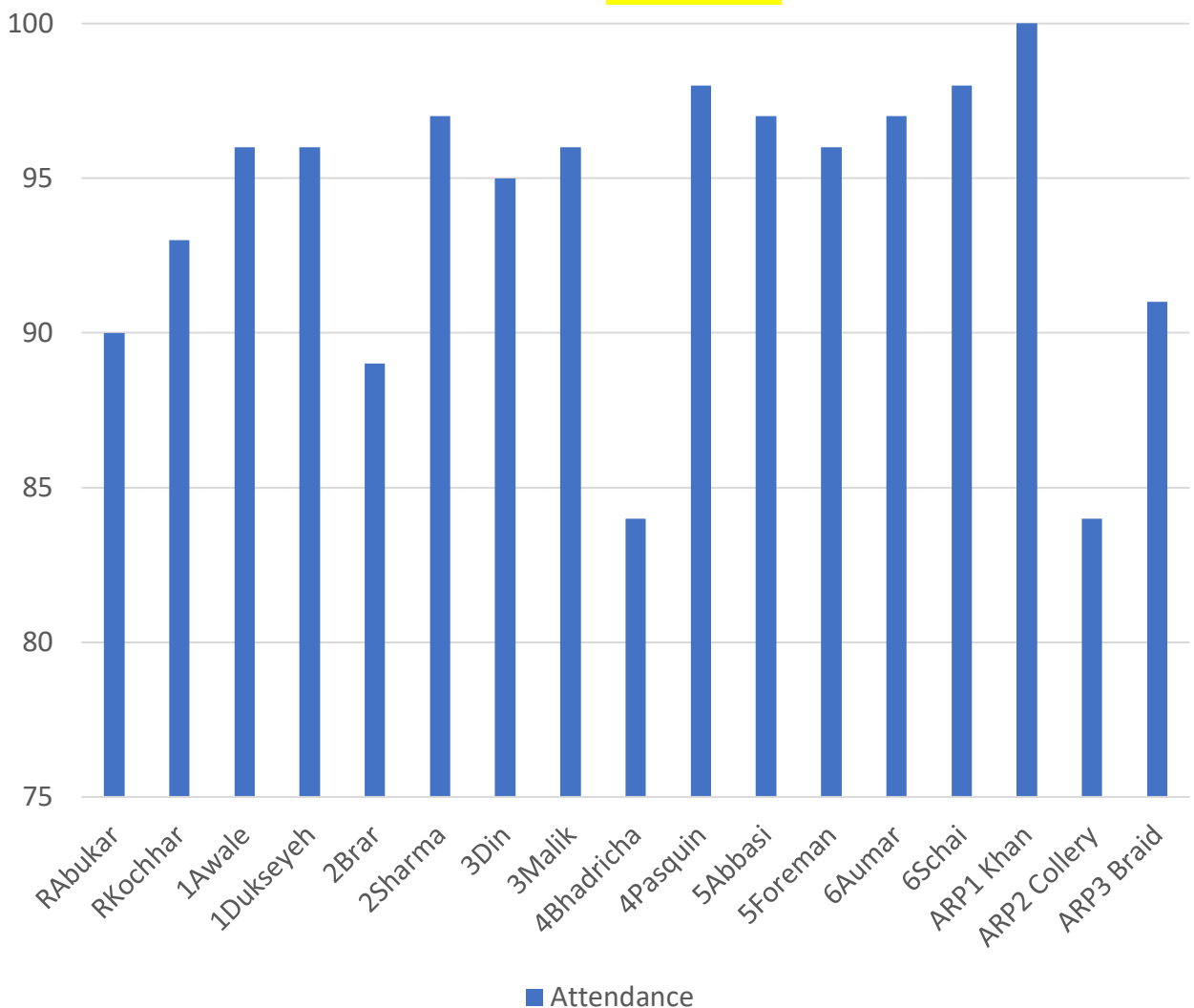


Attendance at Havelock

Please continue watching the videos with your child on Class Dojo every day and practice the example booklets sent home weekly.

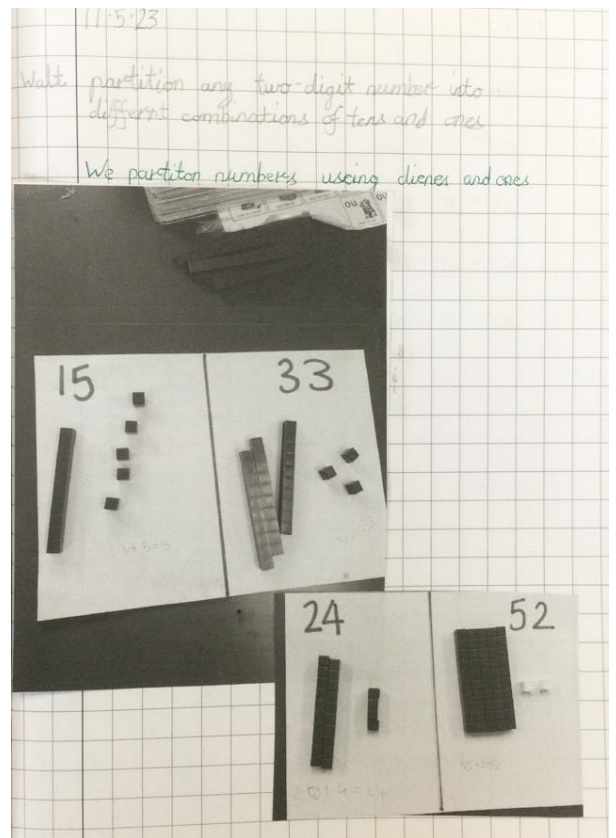
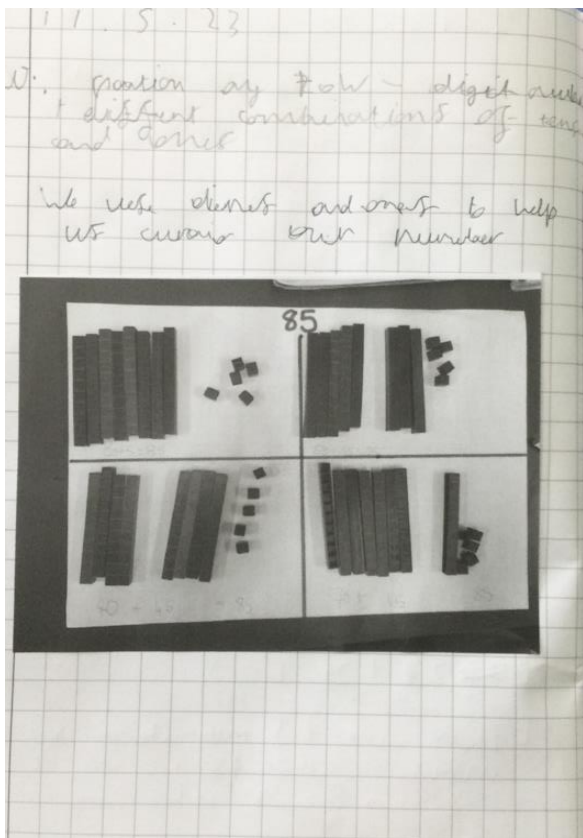

English at Havelock Year 1

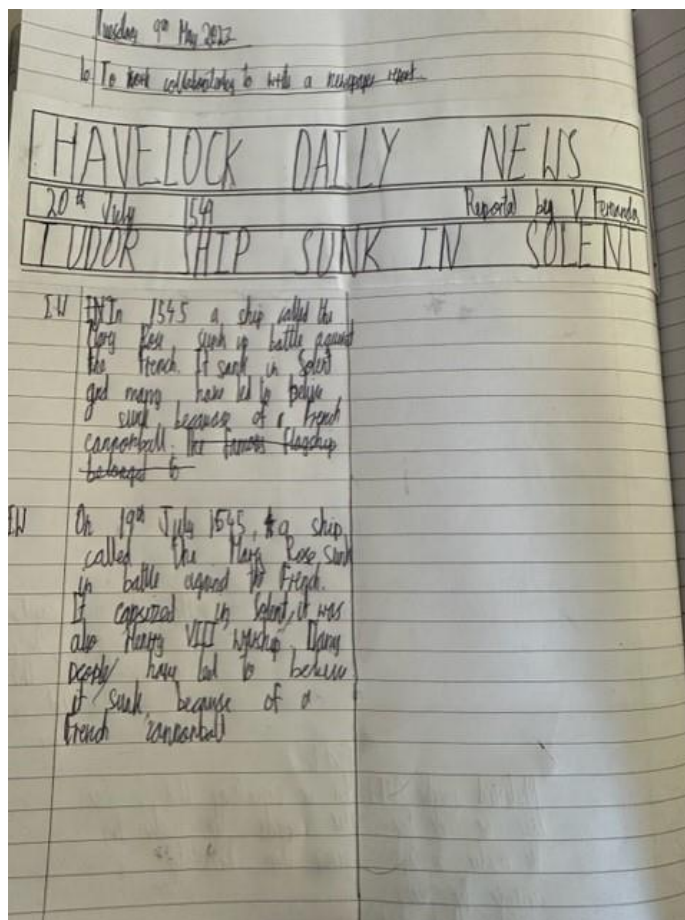

PE Year 1

In PE, Year 1 have been learning about Yoga. The children learnt about mindfulness and awareness. They practiced poses and techniques that helped them connect their mind and body. The aim of this unit is to improve their wellbeing by building strength, flexibility and balance.

As sports day approaches, the children have also begun practicing various skills in Athletics. Year 1 children have worked extremely hard to learn and improve their running skills (at different speeds, changing direction), jumping and throwing.

In all the athletic lessons, the children have engaged in activities that encourage teamwork and achieving their personal best. Keep it up Year 1s!

PE Year 3

In Athletics, Year 3 have been developing their running, jumping and throwing techniques. They have been set challenges for distance and time that involve using different styles and combinations of running, jumping and throwing. All the pupils worked hard to think about how to achieve their greatest possible speed, distance or accuracy to achieve their personal best.

During their rounders lessons, the children have learnt how to score points by striking a ball into space and running around cones or bases. They have been focusing on developing their throwing, catching and batting skills. In all activities, the children had to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition.

Well done Year 3s for working in collaboration with others, playing fairly and being respectful of the people they play with and against!

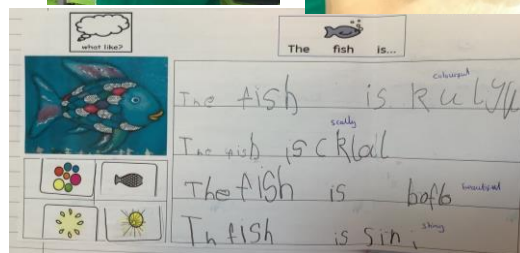

Havelock ARP ARP 1

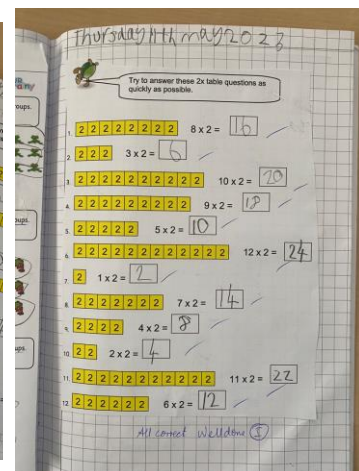
This week, ARP 1 have been learning about the story the rainbow fish. They created their own shimmering rainbow fishes and used adjectives to describe the character. In maths, the children have been learning about capacity (measuring). They used measuring cylinders to measure the correct amount of liquid.



This week, ARP 2 have started to read Where The Wild Things are in English, we compared how Max changes from the beginning to the end of the story. In Science we investigated how friction from various materials changes the distance that a toy car can travel. In maths, we have been working on division, practically sharing out cubes to help us solve problems.



This week, ARP 3 have been learning about the story The Koala who could. They sorted adjectives to describe the different characters. In maths, they have been learning about the 2x tables and trying to recall them as fast as possible.

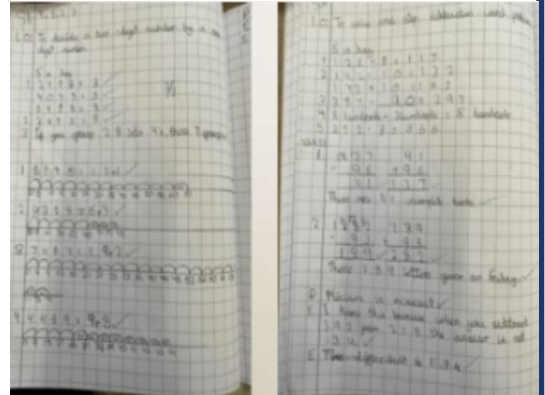

This week it was Year 3 Din's class assembly. Check out the amazing learning our Year 3 students have been doing!

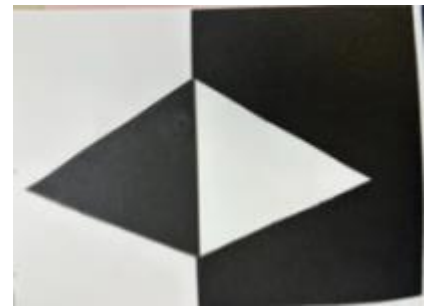
Maths

WHAT IS IT?

Caring Dads provides a 17-week parenting course for fathers who are in contact with their children or have the expectation of being in contact with them.

It is a cognitive behaviour therapy programme for up to 16 fathers and is delivered by trained facilitators with a background in child development or offender management.
