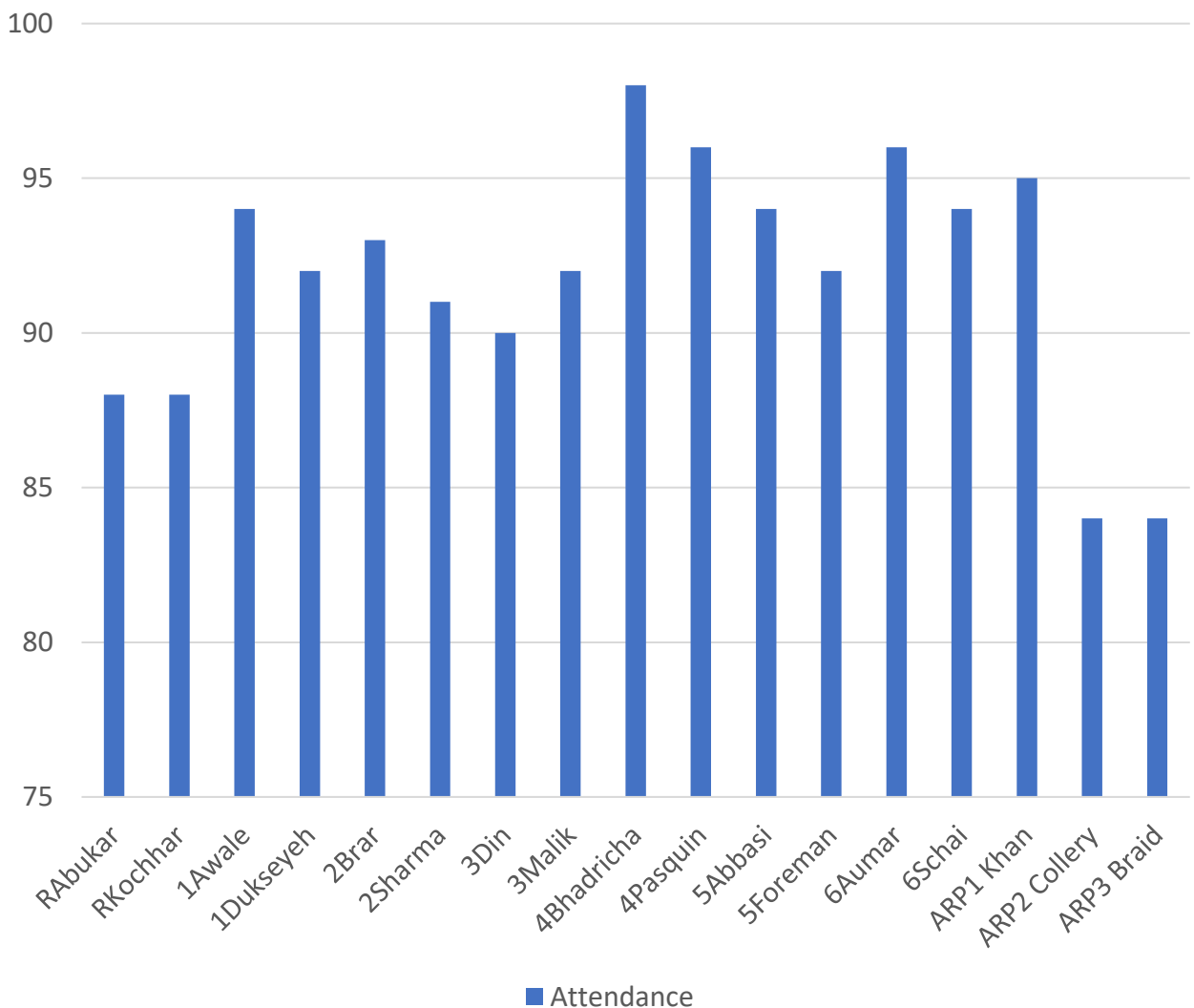

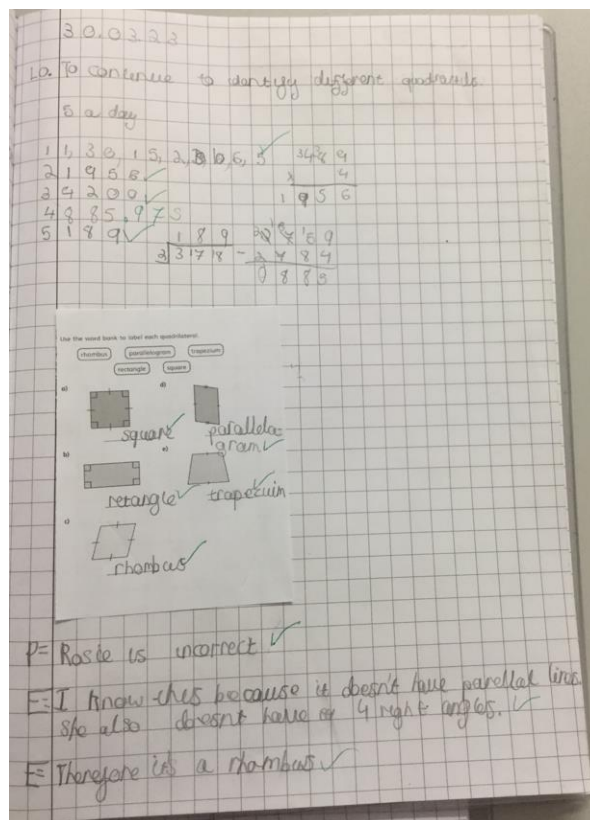

Maths at Havelock - Year 4

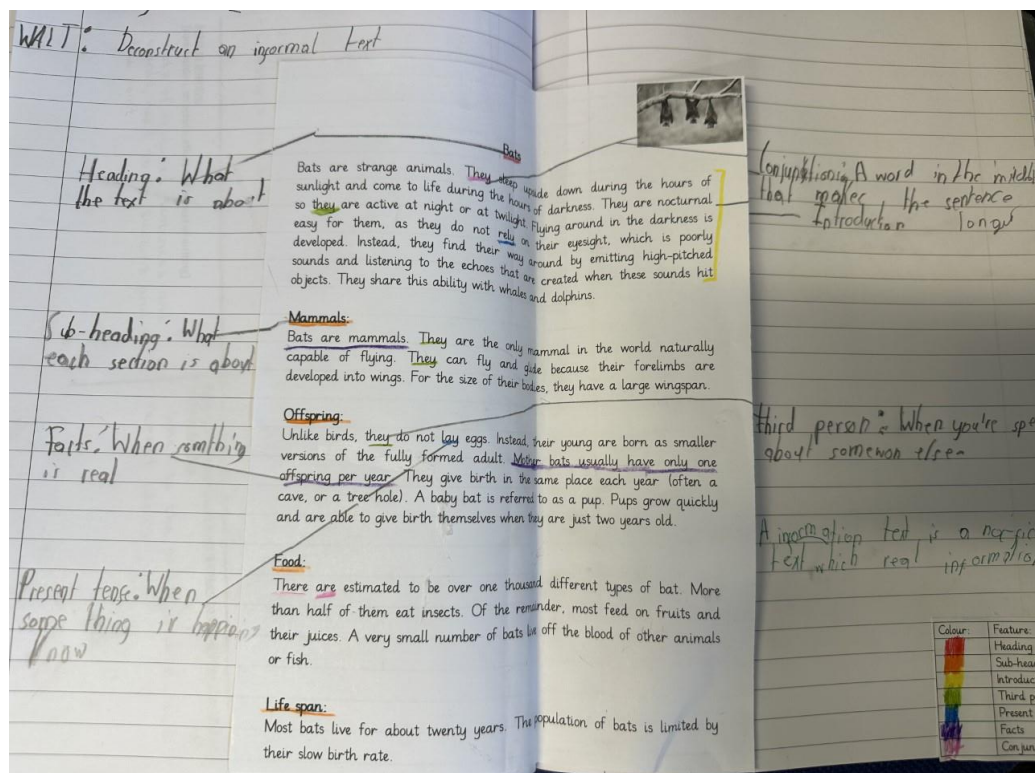

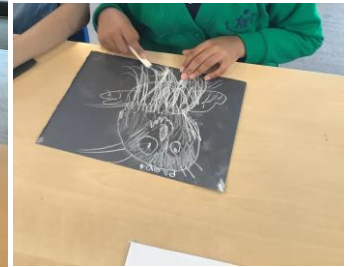
Reception children have been learning about recipes. They can write a list of ingredients and write instructions on how to make bread.





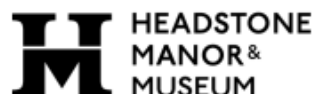
