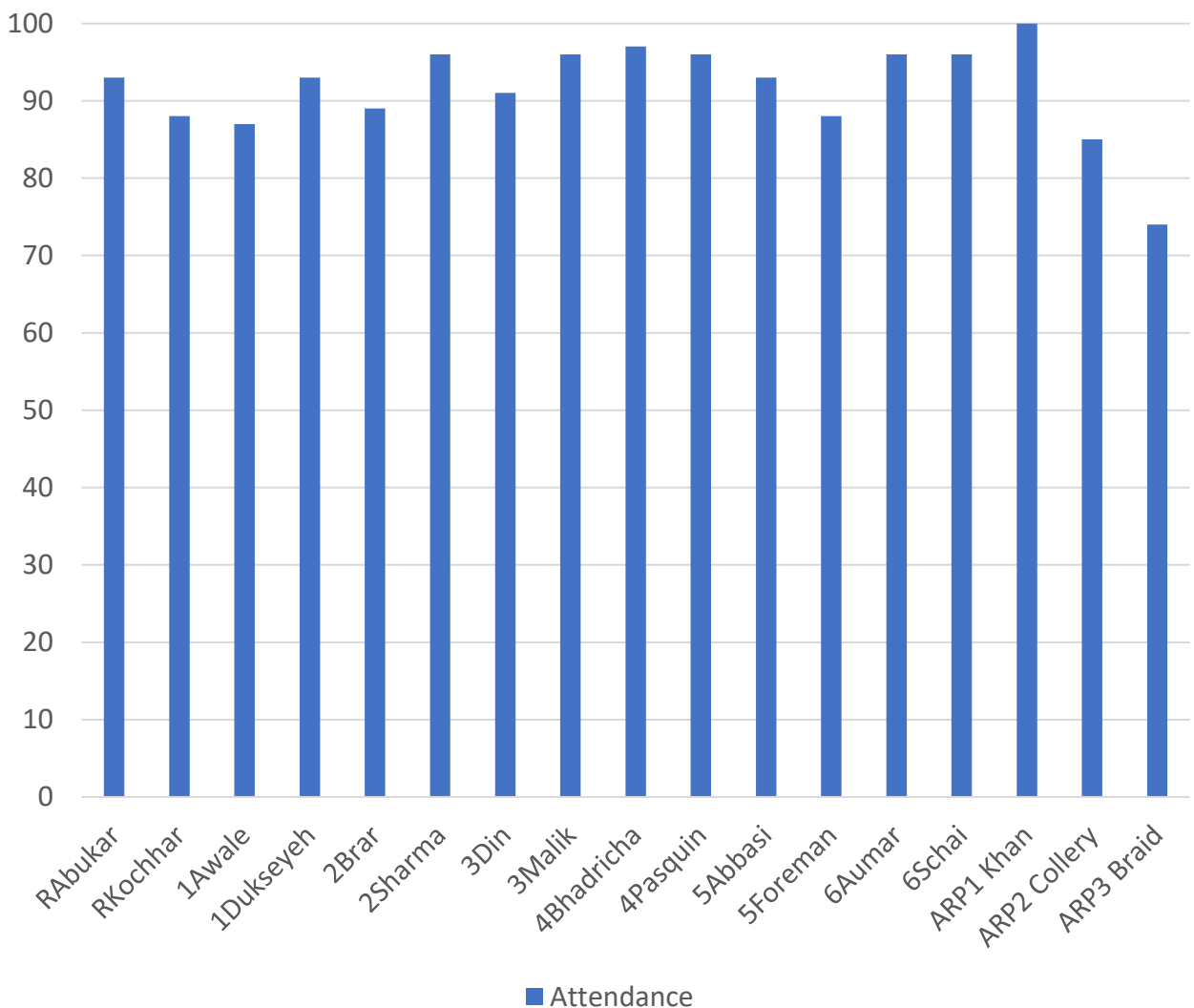
Attendance at Havelock

Maths at Havelock - Year 4

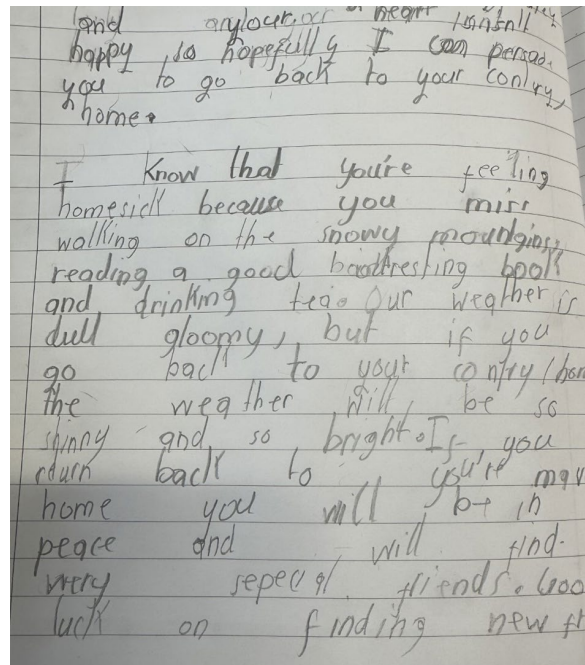
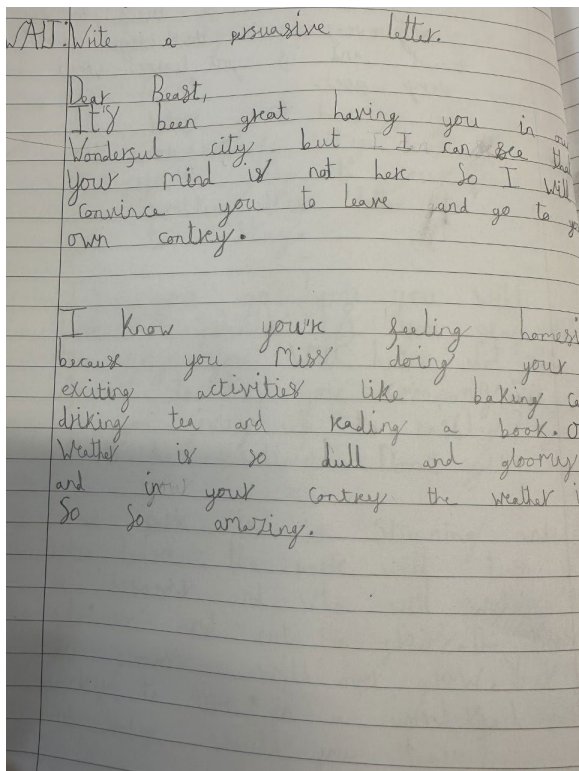

English at Havelock - Year 2

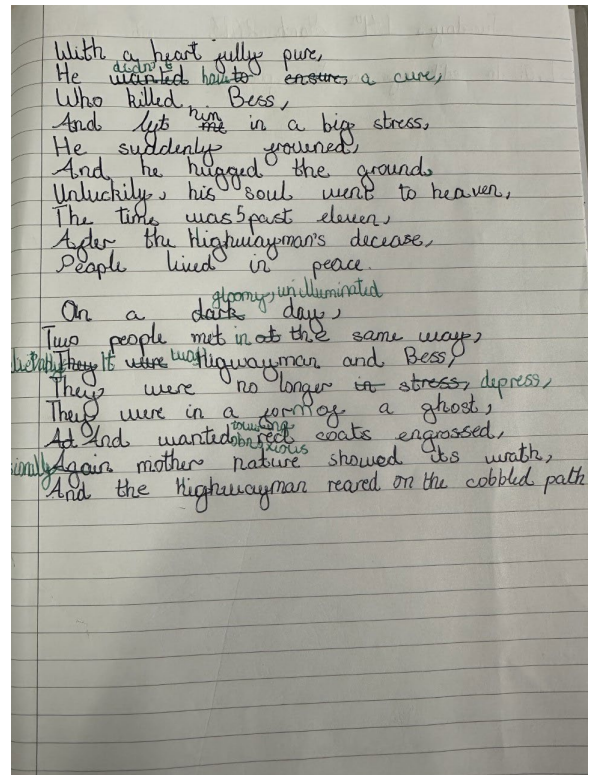
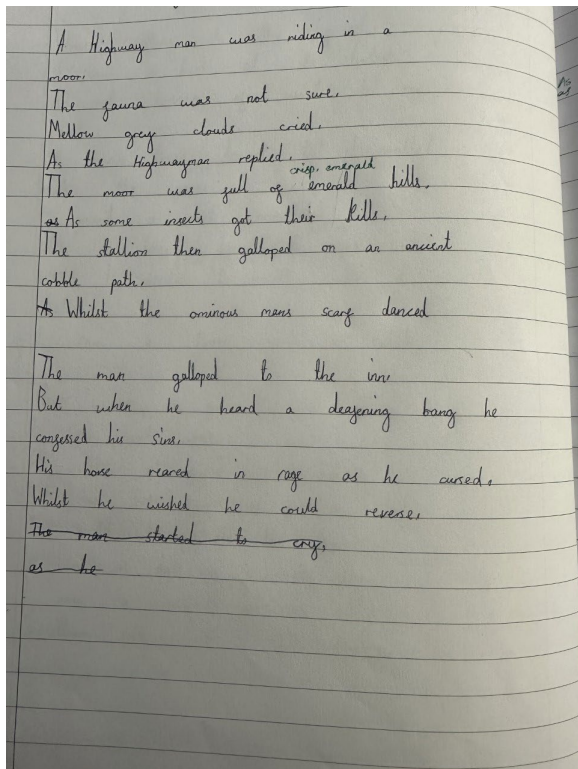

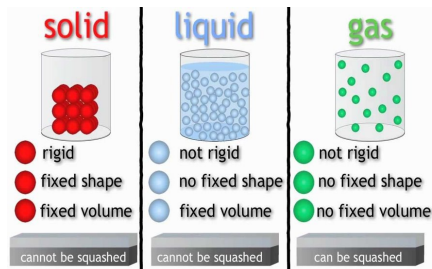


Class Assembly

This week it was Year 4 Ms. Bhadricha's class assembly.

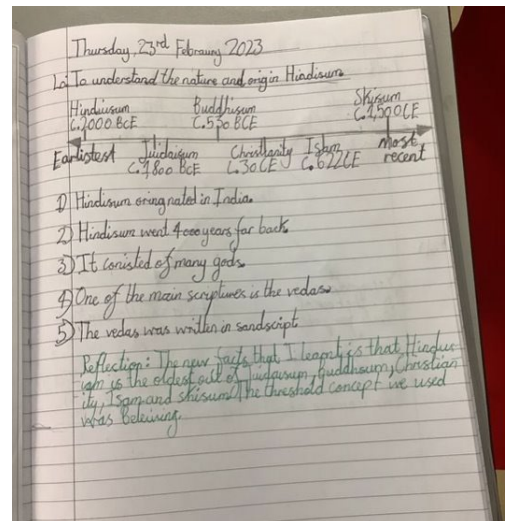
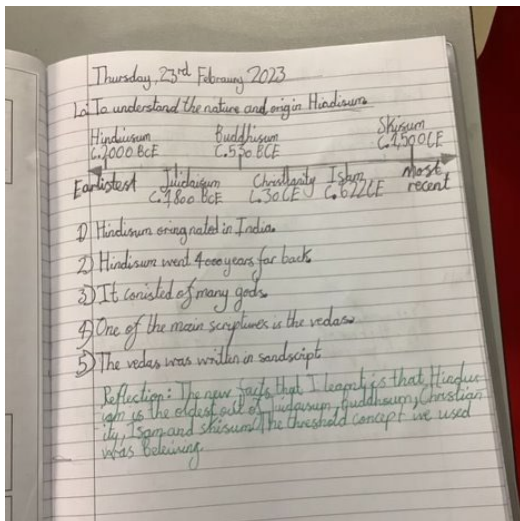
Science:

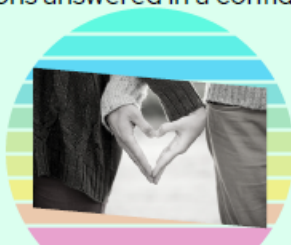


TALKING TO CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE ABOUT GENDER IDENTITY AND SEXUALITY

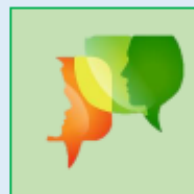

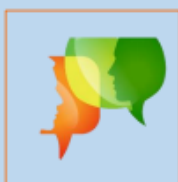

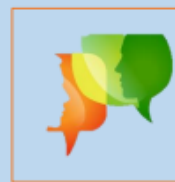
