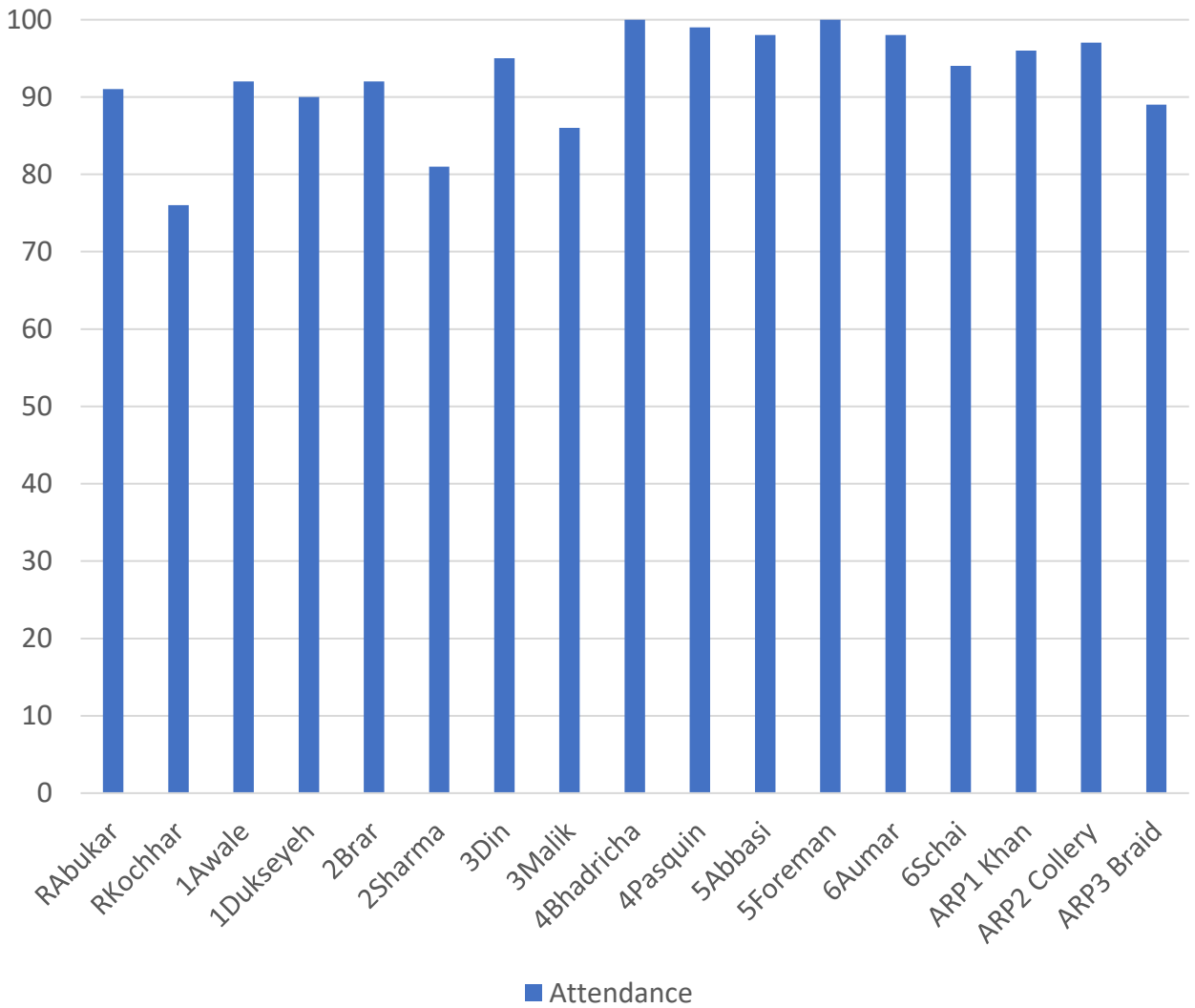
Attendance at Havelock

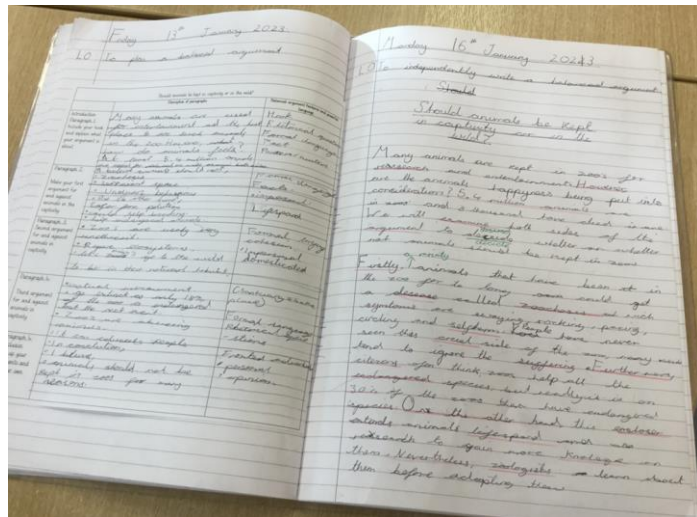

This week, year 5 have shown resilience in their learning throughout lessons. They applied their prior knowledge to support them in writing a balanced argument for English. They used oracy to help them formulate their arguments at first and then used this to develop their writing. When some children faced difficulties with their writing, they referred back to knowledge organisers, the deconstruction text, as well as using ideas from the working walls to develop their arguments.

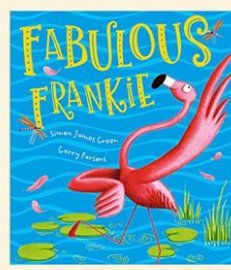

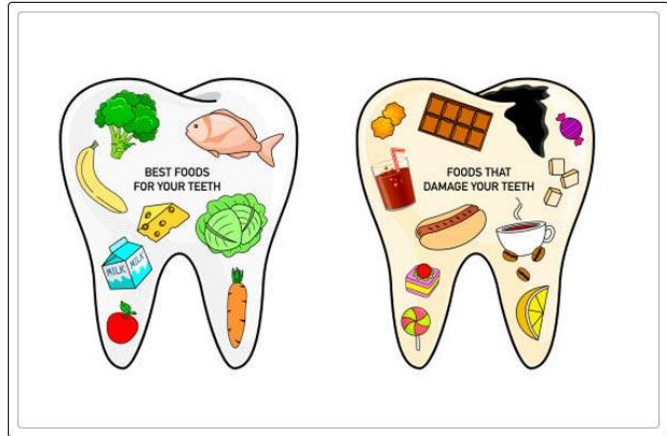
The bright covers of his books will entice you in (you can definitely judge these books by their covers!) and keep you entertained with its pages.

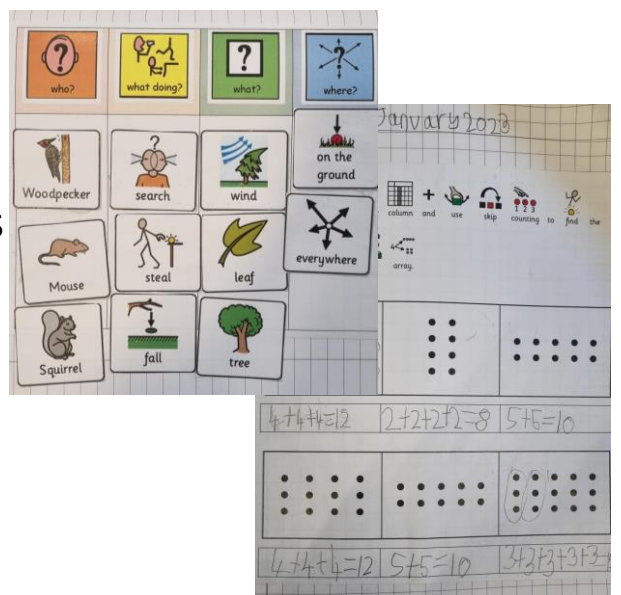
Havelock ARP

In English, ARP1 have read a non-fiction text about minibeasts and in maths they have learnt the difference between full and empty.



This week ARP2 have learnt to measure in metres and centimetres. They used rulers to measure the length of lines and trundle wheels to measure the playground.

This week ARP3 have been beginning their journey to learn multiplication by looking at arrays and using skip counting techniques to quickly count the total and show this with repeated addition. They have also been categorising words from their class book, 'The Leaf Thief' into word classes using colourful semantics.

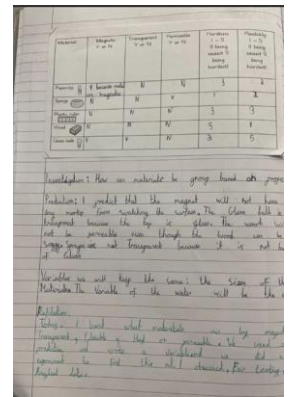
Class Assembly It was 5Abbasi's assembly.

Year 5's big question for materials was, 'What are the properties of materials and how can they be changed?' They looked at previous links to their science learning. They have also carried out investigations.

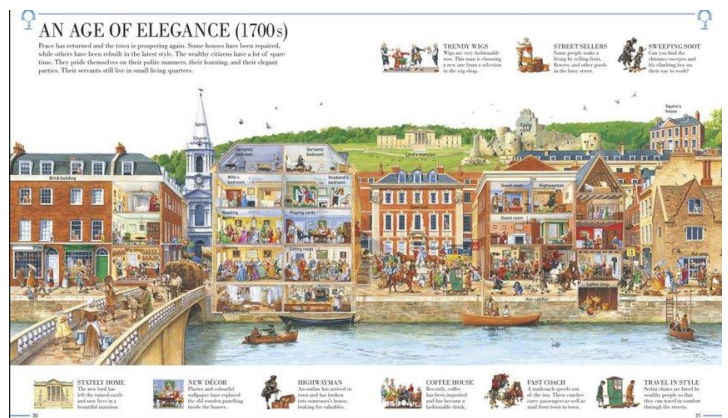
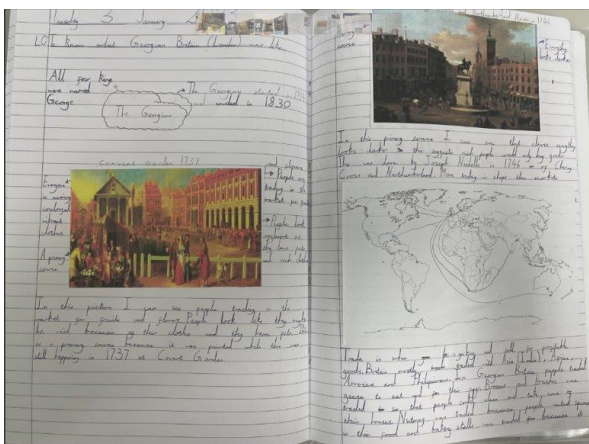

Would you like to understand more about returning back to school from the Christmas break and re-engaging back into routines and supporting your child through this time? We will introduce emotional regulation techniques to support the family in returning back to school routines.

Who?

The Ealing MHST is a service designed to **support the wellbeing of children and young people in education settings**, aiming to provide evidence-based support at the earliest signs of difficulties and promote life-long positive mental health.

What?

We are offering a workshop providing information to help you **understand and manage your child's behaviour and supporting them through their return to school**. Grab a hot drink and a biscuit - there is an accompanying resource pack so you don't need to take notes!

The workshop will take place on **Tuesday 31st of January at 12pm** via **Microsoft Teams** video conferencing software. The workshop will last one hour with a 45-minute presentation followed by 15 minutes for questions.
