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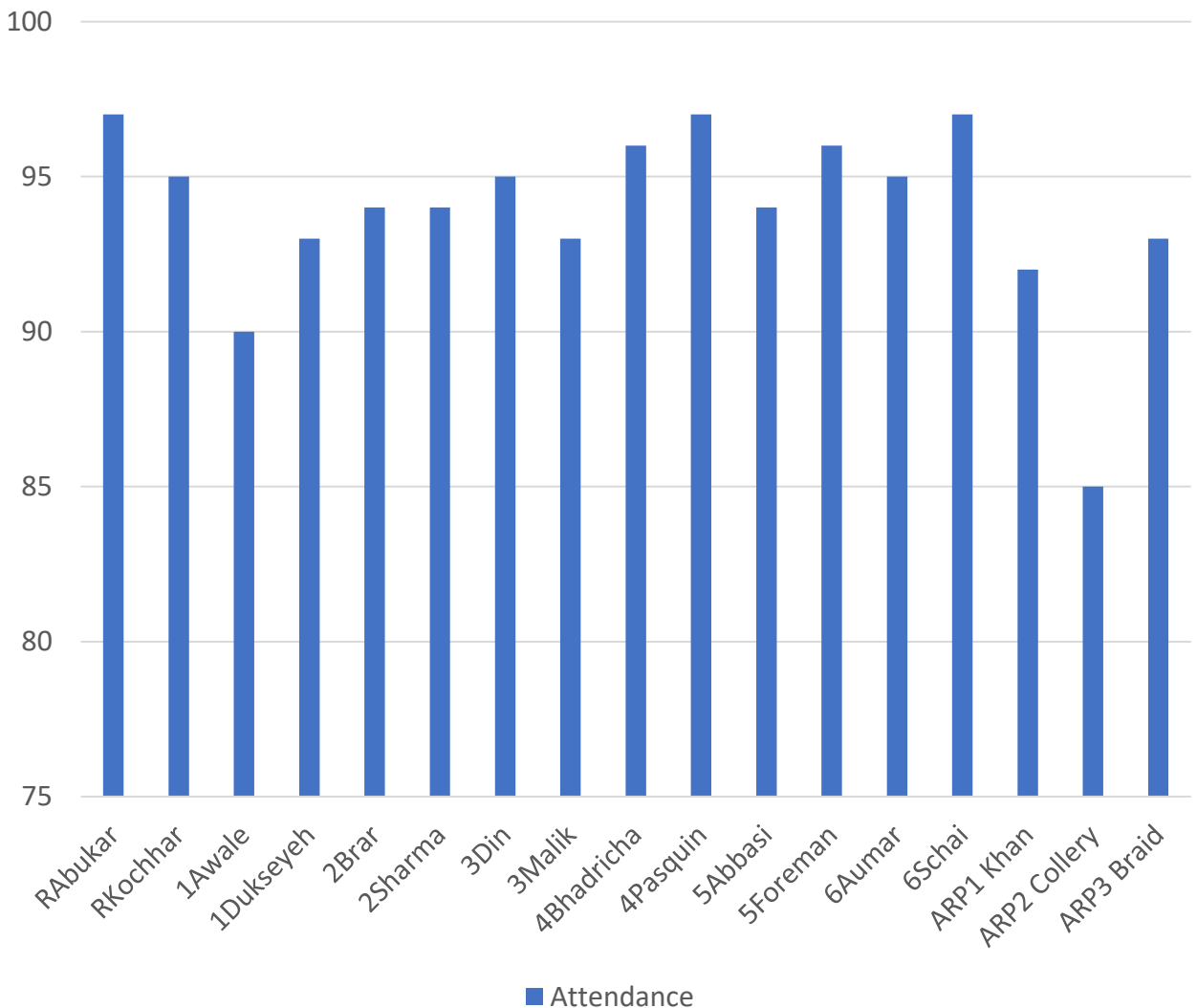
Attendance at Havelock

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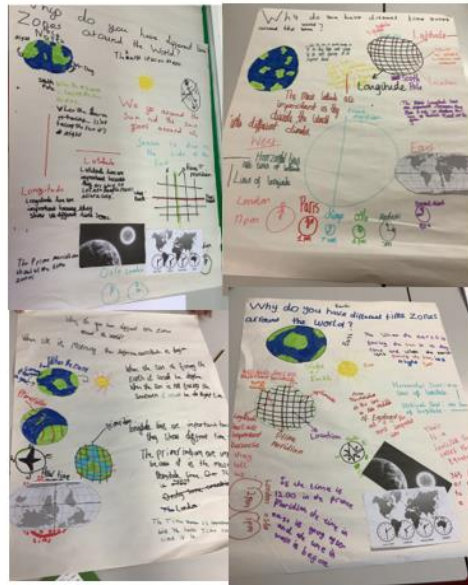


Havelock Primary's 5Rs – Year 4

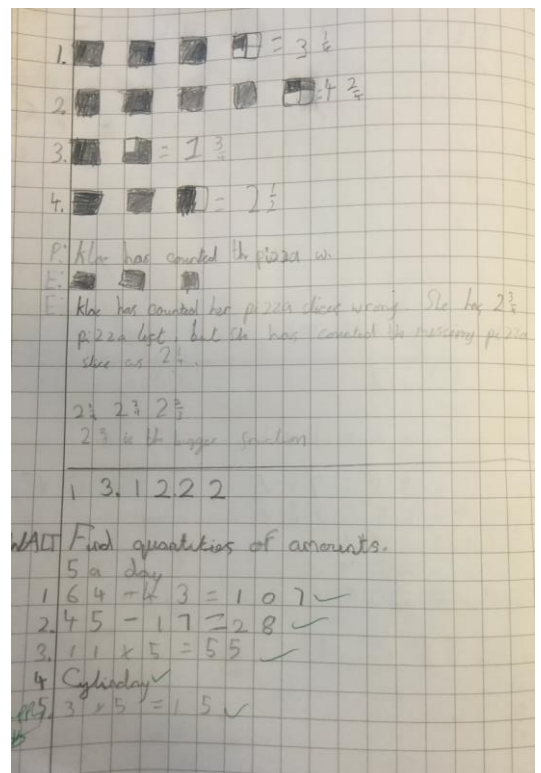
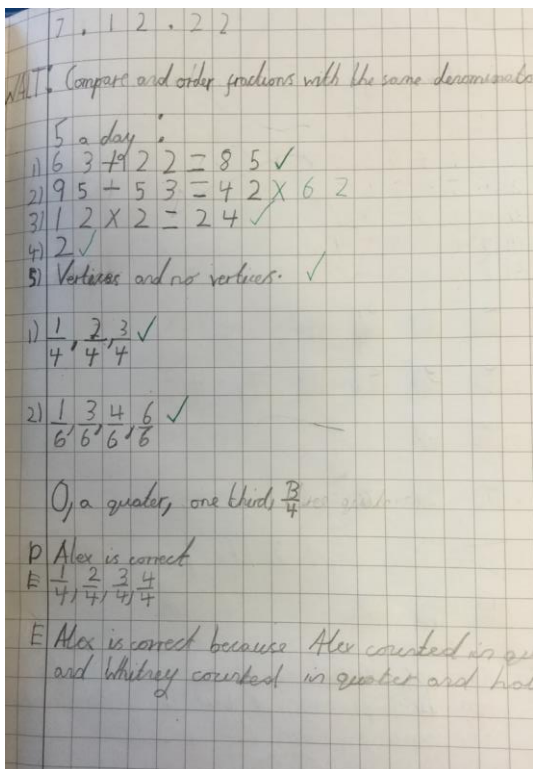


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Maths at Havelock –Year 2

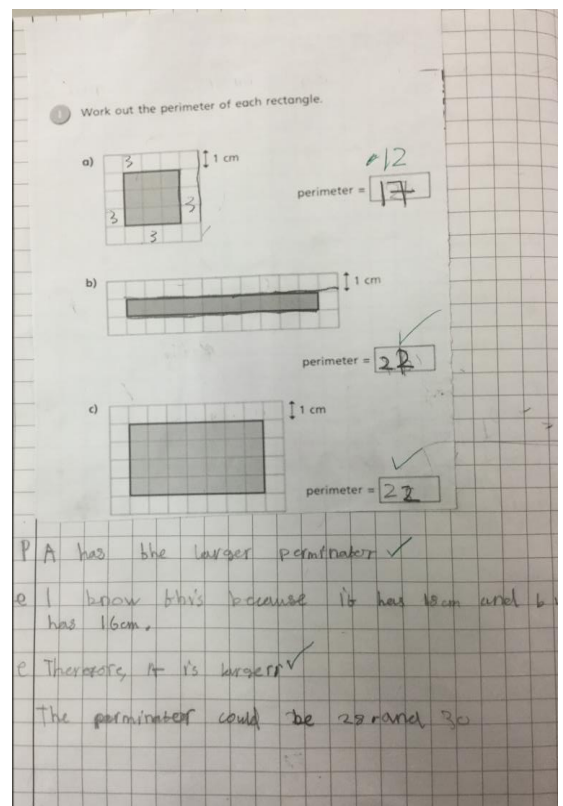
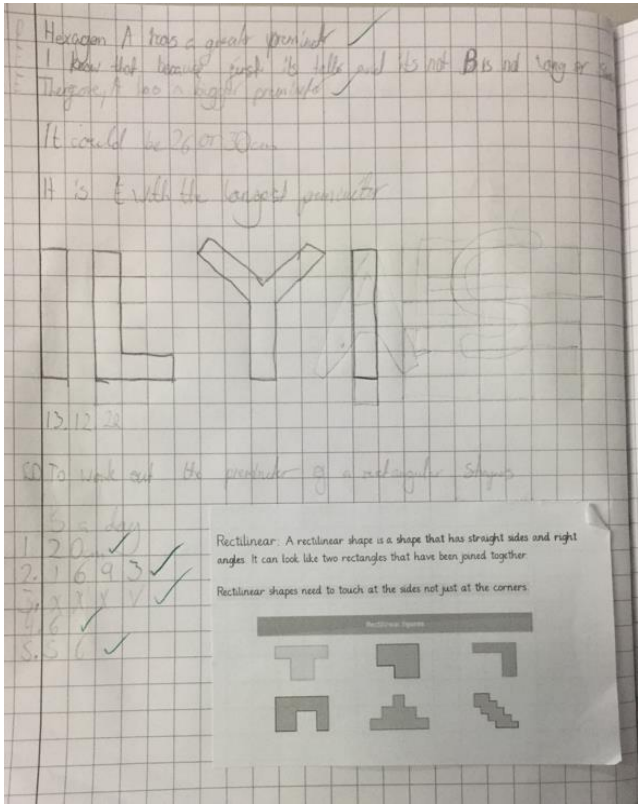


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Maths at Havelock – Year 4

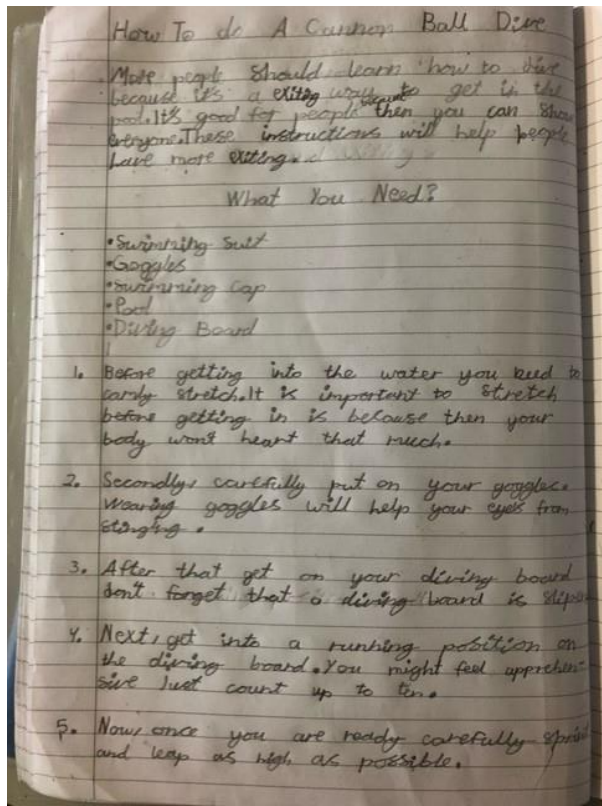

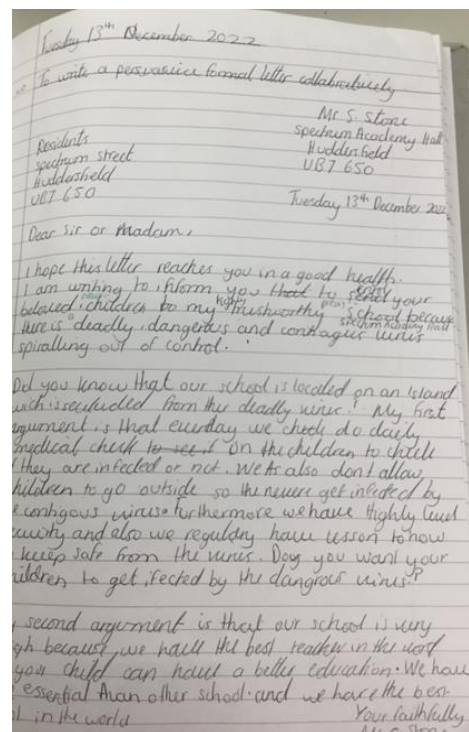
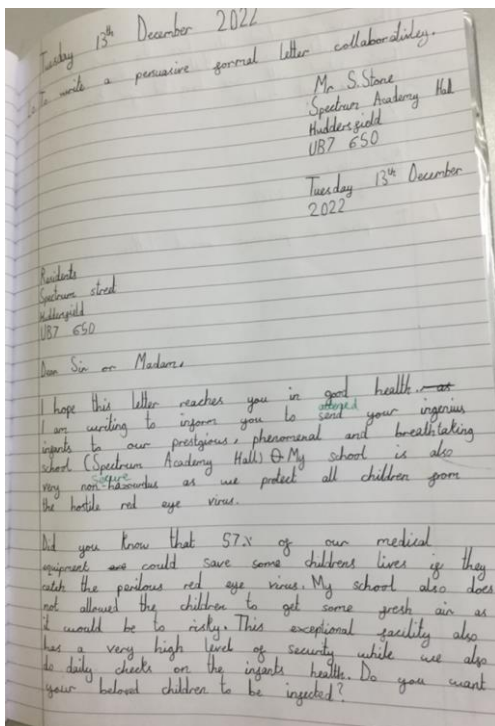
Vocabulary	Definition

Year 2 made some healthy wraps this week! They washed and cut salad and added lots of fillings such as cheese and meat. The wraps tasted delicious!

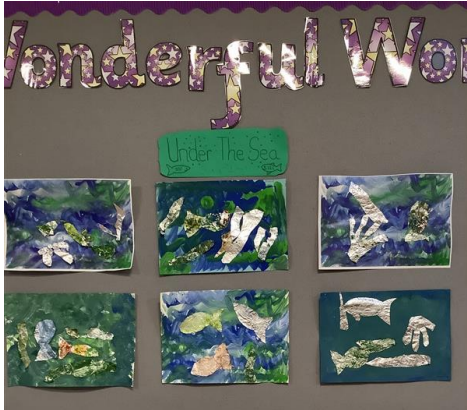


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Havelock ARP

 - Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
 - Working Tax Credit run-on
 - Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

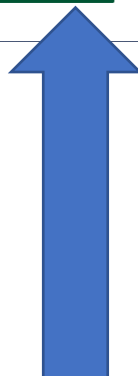

It is based upon four constructs or building blocks: self-awareness, appropriate expectations, positive discipline and empathy. The course is for parents of children 3-12 years.
