Southall Active Travel Consultation – Have your Say

Over the next few weeks, Ealing Council and Let's Go Southall will be consulting on how to improve opportunities for walking, cycling and using public transport in Southall.

The purpose of this initial consultation is to better understand, from people living, working and visiting Southall:

- a) How you currently travel around Southall
- b) The barriers you face walking, cycling and using public transport in Southall
- c) The types of interventions that would encourage you to walk, cycle and use public transport more.

Ultimately, you know Southall best, so we need your help.

The consultation will run from the 1st December to the 14th January. There are plenty of ways to get involved.

Or you can come and share your views at any of the following events:

- **Workshop #1** – Southall Manor House at 10am-1pm on Saturday 17th December
- **Workshop #2** – Southall Manor House at 10am – 1pm on Saturday 14th January

These workshops are an opportunity to discuss walking, cycling and using public transport with council officers and Let's Go Southall representatives.

There will be a presentation about the consultation, followed by a discussion in small groups. Please come along to ask questions and have your views heard.

- **Pop-up #1** – Southall Station at 5pm-7pm on Tuesday 20th December
- **Pop-up #2** – Southall Broadway near the Barclays at 12pm-3pm on Wednesday 11th January

This will be an informal opportunity to learn more about the consultation.

Council officers and Let's Go Southall representatives will be handing out flyers, answering questions and listening to your views on walking, cycling and public transport in Southall.

Please drop by to speak with a member of the team.

You do not need to register in advance for any of the events, simply turn up on the day.

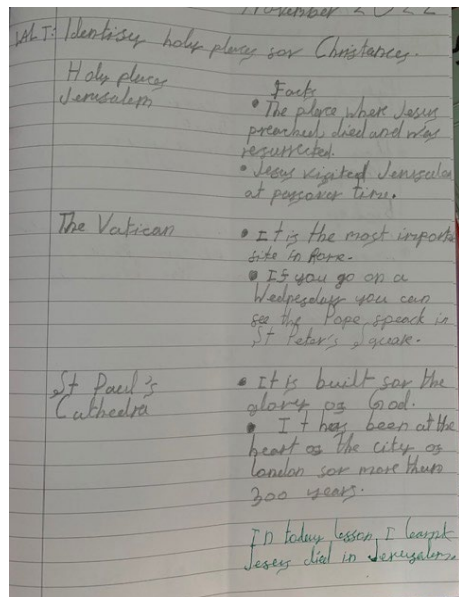
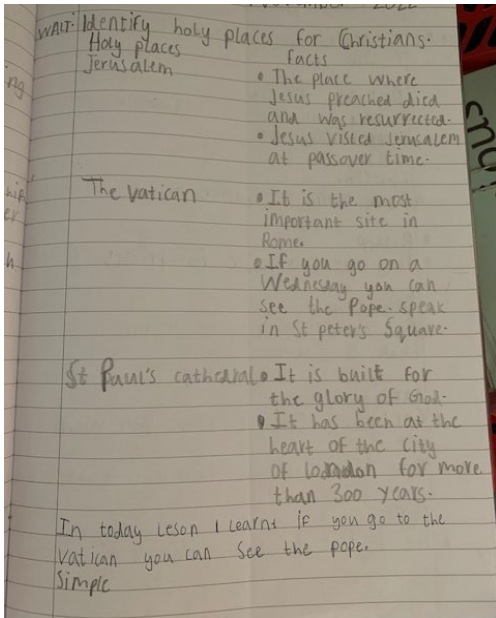

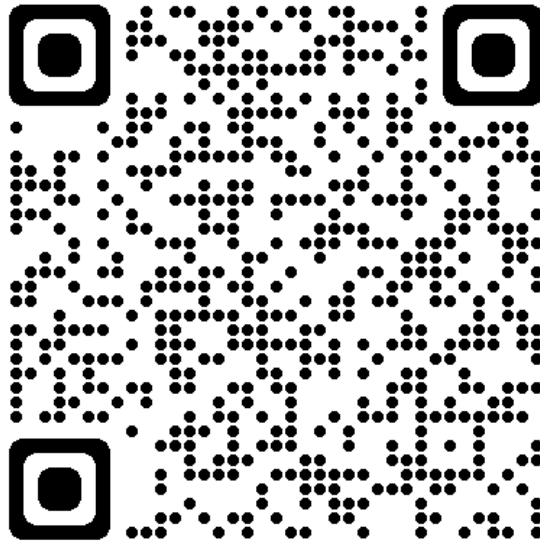
Phonics Page

Reception children have been working extremely hard learning their phonics sounds, blending to read words and to use Fred fingers to write words.

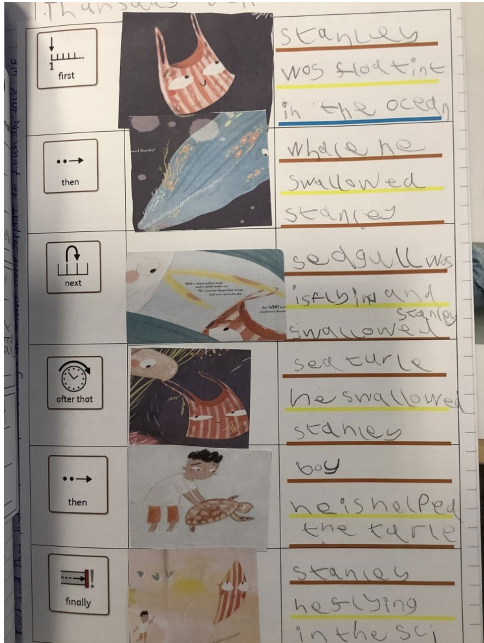

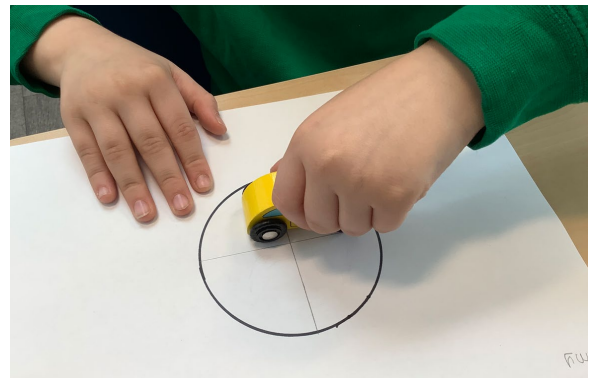
Havelock ARP

In ARP 1, pupils have been learning about one less (subtraction). They have been singing and acting out the song 'Ten Green Bottles' to help them understand this concept.



This week, ARP2 sequenced the pictures from the story 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley.' They then used a word mat, deciding which words were the who/ what doing/ what/where words they needed, and wrote sentences to describe each stage of the story.

This week ARP3 have been learning about quarter turns, half turns and full turns. They used toy cars to demonstrate their understanding of the different positions and directions, linking their learning to quarters and halves from fractions.

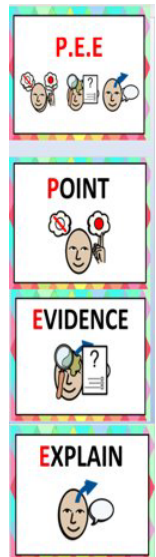
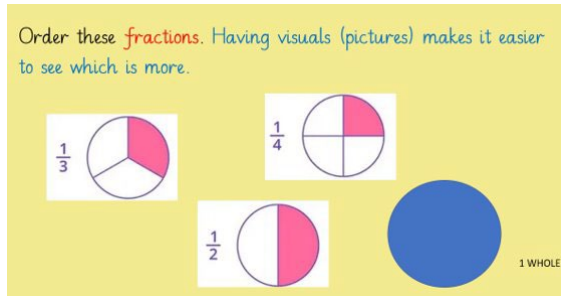

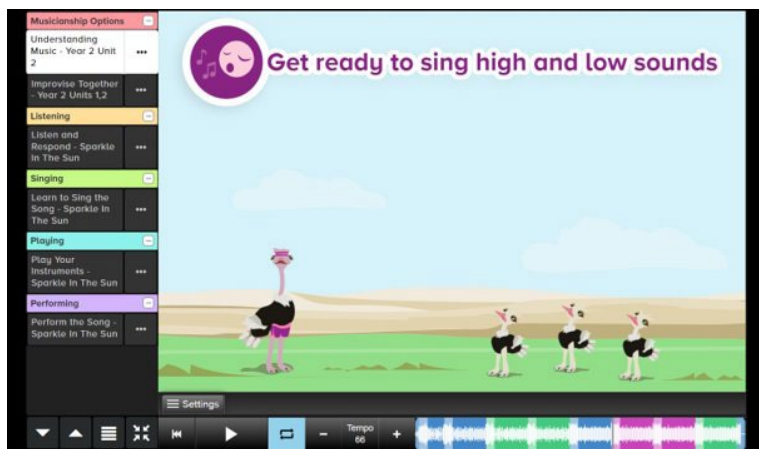
Maths:
