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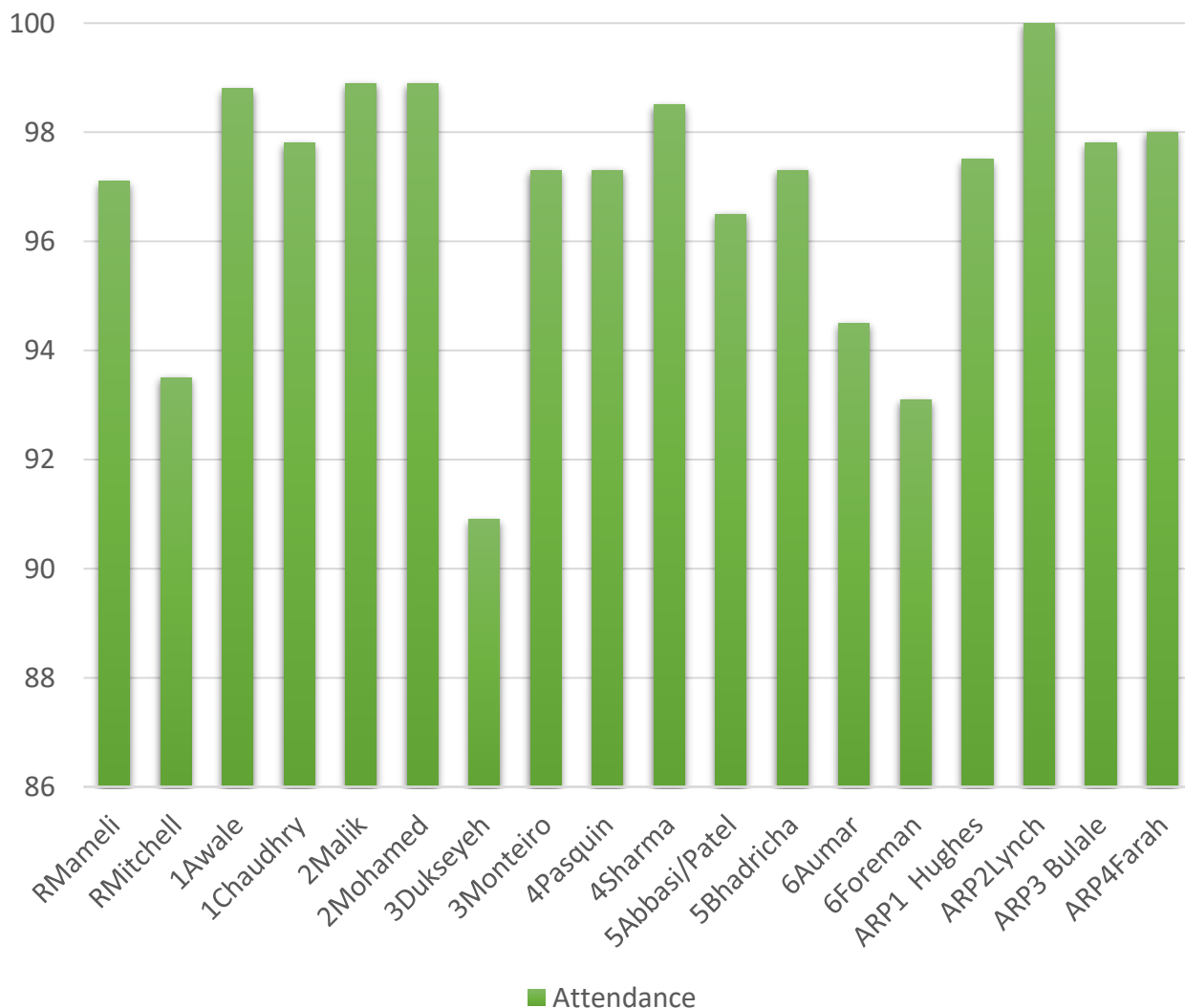


2025 - 2026 Attendance at Havelock

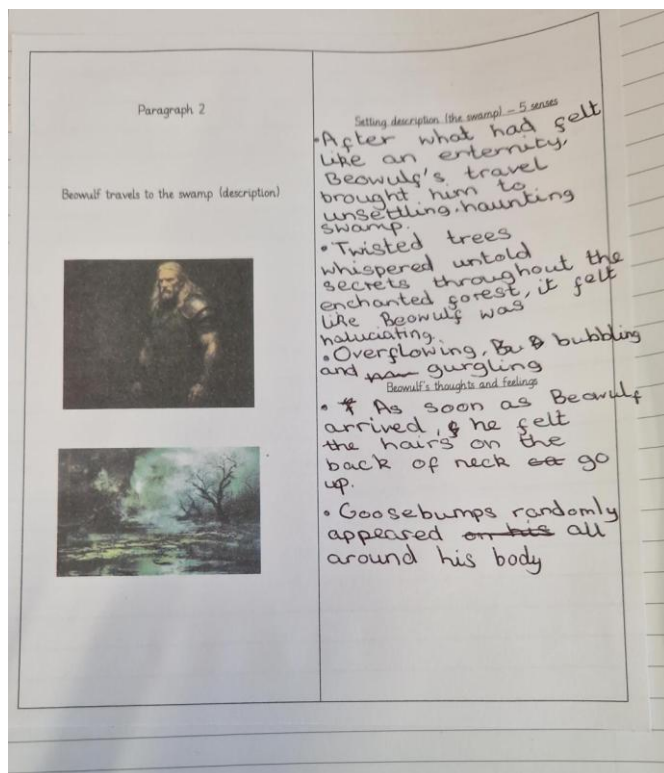
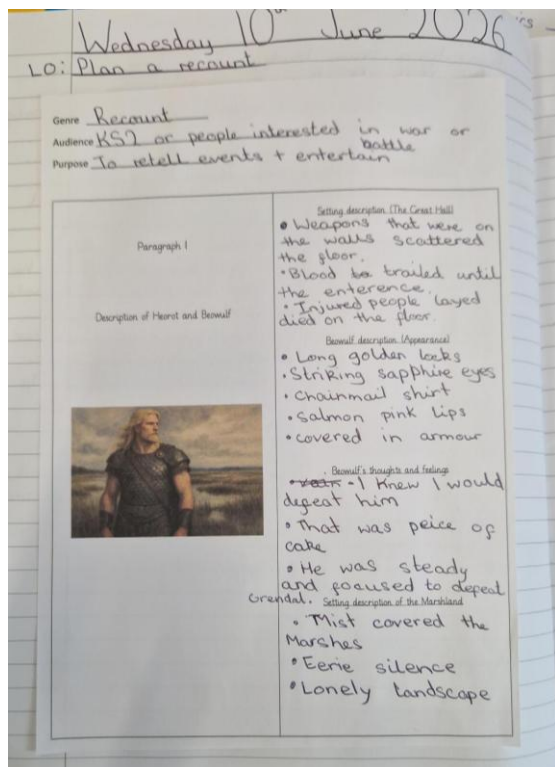
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English - Year 6

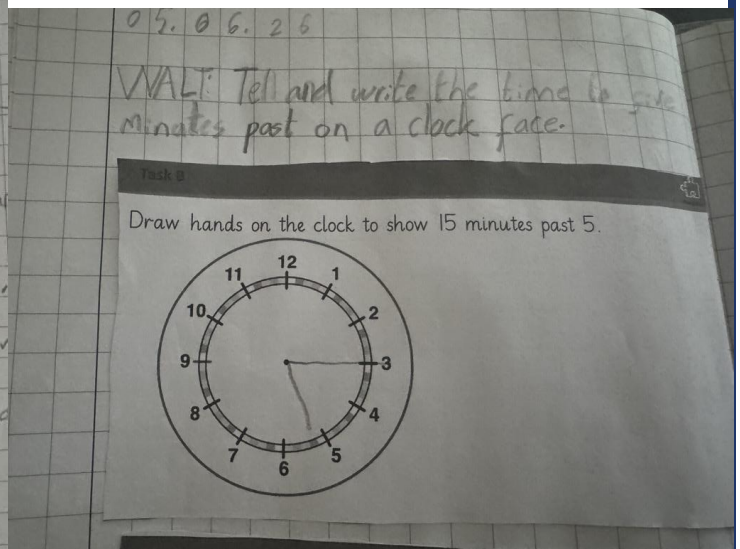
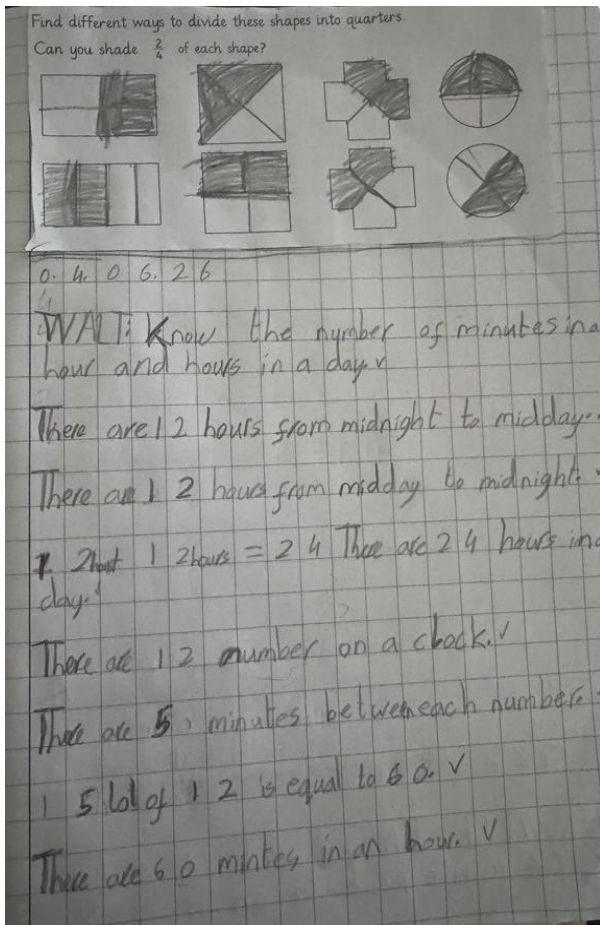
Year 6 have been working hard on their recounts inspired by the story of Beowulf. The children focused on retelling key events using clear sequencing, powerful vocabulary, and effective paragraphing. They enjoyed exploring heroic characters, dramatic moments, and strong descriptive language to bring their writing to life.



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Maths - Year 2

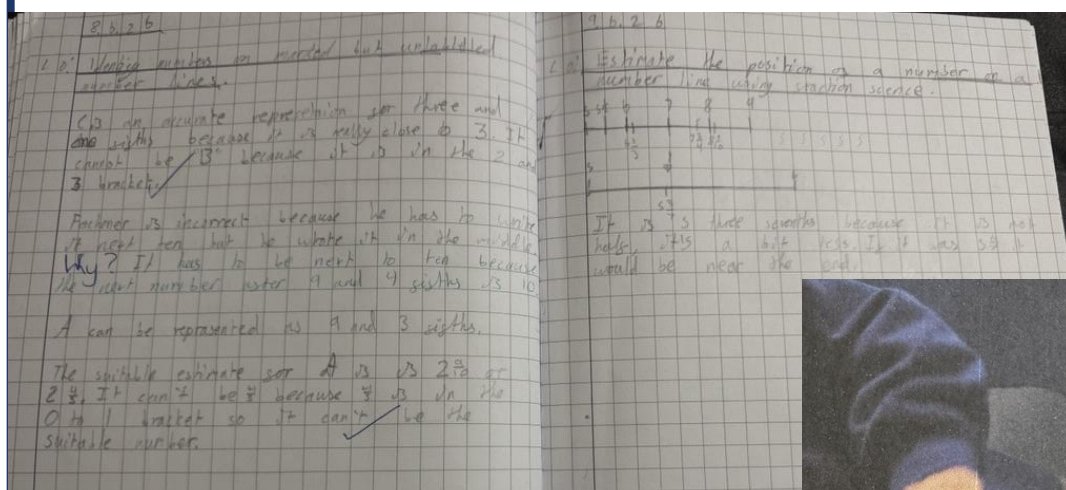
Year 2 have been learning about fractions, focusing on understanding that $\frac{2}{4}$ is equivalent to $\frac{1}{2}$. They have explored a range of ways to represent fractions, including diagrams, objects and number lines, to deepen their understanding. In addition, pupils have been practising telling and writing the time, particularly focusing on times to 15 minutes past the hour.



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Maths - Year 4

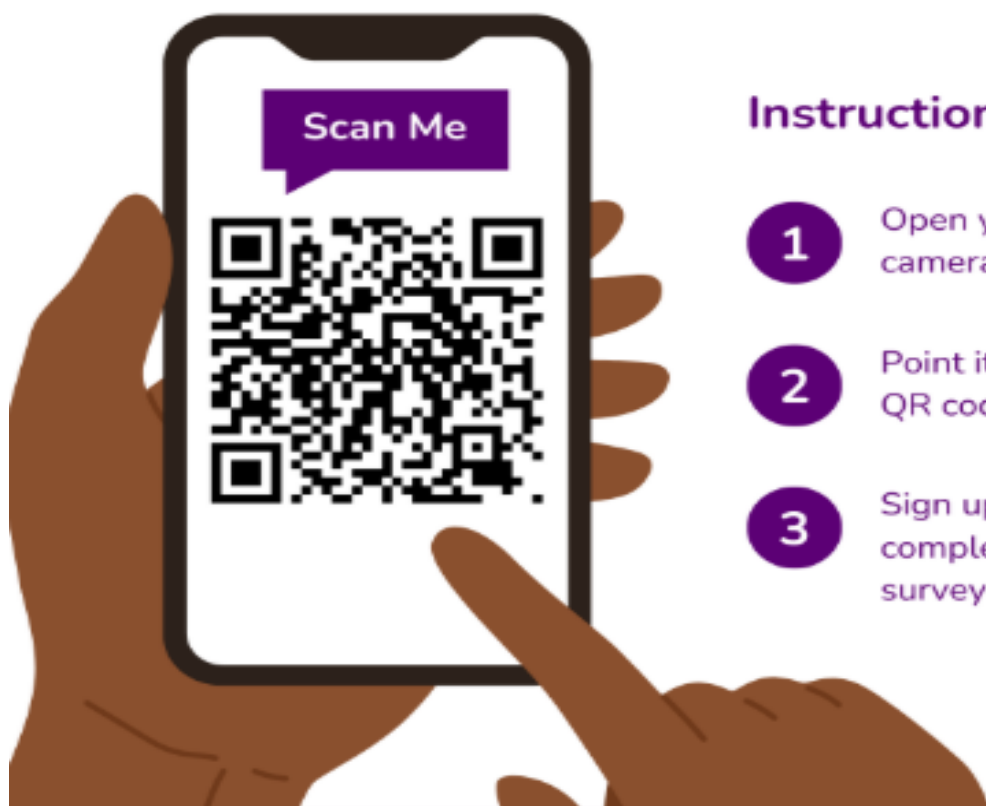
Year 4 have been working really hard on their learning about fractions. They began by recapping equal and unequal parts and what makes a whole. They have learnt how to compose and decompose mixed numbers and can accurately label a range of fractions on a number line. They also have developed their fraction sense by estimating the positions of fractions on a number line.

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Childrens Dental Care Referrals

HELPING YOUNG SMILES GET OFF TO A GREAT START

Why it's important to refer children for dental care

Healthy smiles start early

Regular dental care helps prevent toothache, infections, and keeps children confident about their smiles.

Some families find it hard to get a dentist

This referral helps to make sure every child can be seen and cared for when they need it most.

A simple referral can make a big difference

Helping children stay happy, healthy, and pain-free.

How to refer to us

1. Scan the QR code or use the link (see below) provided to access the secure referral form.
2. Complete the form with as much information as possible – this helps us assess and triage each referral quickly.
3. Once submitted, our dental team will contact the child's parent or guardian within 48 working hours to arrange an appointment or discuss next steps.

Self-referrals

Parents or guardians can also complete the same referral form themselves. They should simply **write the name of the Children's Centre or referral hub** that gave them the details when completing the form.
